AN ACT

Amending the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), entitled 1 2 "An act relating to the manufacture, sale and possession of 3 controlled substances, other drugs, devices and cosmetics; conferring powers on the courts and the secretary and 4 5 Department of Health, and a newly created Pennsylvania Drug, б Device and Cosmetic Board; establishing schedules of 7 controlled substances; providing penalties; requiring 8 registration of persons engaged in the drug trade and for the 9 revocation or suspension of certain licenses and registrations; and repealing an act," classifying anabolic 10 11 steroids as a Schedule II controlled substance.

12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

13 hereby enacts as follows:

14 Section 1. Section 4(2) of the act of April 14, 1972

15 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug,

16 Device and Cosmetic Act, is amended by adding a clause to read:

17 Section 4. Schedules of Controlled Substances.--The

18 following schedules include the controlled substances listed or

to be listed by whatever official name, common or usual name,
 chemical name, or trade name designated.

4 (2) Schedule II--In determining that a substance comes
5 within this schedule, the secretary shall find: a high potential
6 for abuse, currently accepted medical use in the United States,
7 or currently accepted medical use with severe restrictions, and
8 abuse may lead to severe psychic or physical dependence. The
9 following controlled substances are included in this schedule:

11 (vi) Anabolic steroid includes any material, compound,

12 mixture or preparation that includes any of the following or any

13 isomer, ester, salt or derivative of any of the following that

14 acts in the same manner on the human body:

10	(d.1) A practitioner shall not prescribe, administer or
11	dispense any anabolic steroid for the purpose of enhancing a
12	<u>person's performance in an exercise, sport or game. A</u>
13	<u>practitioner may not prescribe, administer or dispense any</u>
14	anabolic steroid for the purpose of hormonal manipulation
15	intended to increase muscle mass, strength or weight except when
16	medically necessary.

18	Section 3. Section 13(a) and (b) of the act, amended
19	December 14, 1984 (P.L.988, No.200), are amended and subsection
20	(a) is amended by adding a clause to read:
21	Section 13. Prohibited Acts; Penalties(a) The following
22	acts and the causing thereof within the Commonwealth are hereby
23	prohibited:

25	(37) The possession by any person, other than a
26	practitioner, pharmacist or a manufacturer, of twenty-five
27	labels or three 2cc bottles of any anabolic steroid.
28	(b) Any person who violates any of the provisions of clauses
29	(1) through (11), (13) and (15) through (20) <u>or (37)</u> of
30	subsection (a) shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and except for
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clauses (4), (6), (7), (8), (9) and (19) shall, on conviction 1 thereof, be sentenced to imprisonment not exceeding one year or 2 3 to pay a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars (\$5,000), or both, and for clauses (4), (6), (7), (8), (9) and (19) shall, on 4 conviction thereof, be sentenced to imprisonment not exceeding 5 three years or to pay a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars 6 (\$5,000), or both; but, if the violation is committed after a 7 prior conviction of such person for a violation of this act 8 9 under this section has become final, such person shall be sentenced to imprisonment not exceeding three years or to pay a 10 11 fine not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or 12 both.

14 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
