AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, requiring that alternative operator
- 3 service providers make certain disclosures to customers
- 4 before providing service; and regulating certain rates.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 66 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 2906. Rates and disclosures of alternative operator service
- 10 providers.
- 11 (a) IntraLATA toll rates.--The rate charged by an
- 12 alternative operator service provider for an intraLATA toll call
- 13 shall not exceed the retail tariff toll rate of the local
- 14 exchange carrier serving the same call or, in the case of a coin
- 15 telephone, the charge for using the telephone plus the retail
- 16 tariff toll rate of the local exchange carrier serving the coin
- 17 telephone for the same call.

- 1 (b) InterLATA toll rates. -- The rate charged by an
- 2 alternative operator service provider for an interLATA toll call
- 3 shall not exceed the highest retail tariff toll rate of any
- 4 certificated interLATA telephone service provider in this
- Commonwealth for the same call or, in the case of a coin 5
- telephone, the charge for using the telephone plus the highest 6
- retail tariff toll rate of any certificated interLATA telephone 7
- 8 service provider in this Commonwealth for the same call.
- 9 (c) Disclosures. -- Any alternative operator service provider,
- 10 aggregator or owner, operator or lessee of a coin telephone
- 11 offering or providing operator-assisted services in this
- Commonwealth shall, before providing the service, disclose to 12
- 13 the customer the identity of the alternative operator service
- 14 provider handling the operator-assisted call and upon request
- 15 provide the rates, terms and conditions for operator-assisted
- 16 calls. These disclosures shall be displayed on, or in the
- immediate vicinity of, the telephone equipment owned or 17
- 18 controlled by the aggregator, or by the alternative operator
- 19 service provider if the alternative operator service provider
- 20 owns or provides the telephone, or on, or in the immediate
- 21 vicinity of the coin telephone.
- 22 (d) Equal access. -- The alternative operator service
- 23 provider, aggregator or owner, operator or lessee of a coin
- 24 telephone shall offer to switch a customer back to the
- 25 originating local exchange carrier offering operator-assisted
- 26 services and inform the customer that the switch will be made
- 27 without charge. An alternative operator service provider OR
- 28
- 29 enter into any contract or agreement with an aggregator or
- 30 owner, operator or lessee of a coin telephone which does not

CERTIFICATED INTERLATA TELEPHONE SERVICE PROVIDER shall not

- 1 provide a customer, using either a telephone owned or controlled
- 2 by the aggregator or alternative operator service provider or a
- 3 coin telephone, with the means to access any other certificated
- 4 interLATA telephone service provider operating in the relevant
- 5 geographic area, through the access method chosen by the
- 6 <u>certificated interLATA telephone service provider, or to access</u>
- 7 <u>a local exchange carrier operator or emergency telephone number.</u>
- 8 (e) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 9 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 10 <u>subsection</u>:
- 11 <u>"Aggregator." Every corporation, association, partnership or</u>
- 12 person that is not a public utility, and that, in the ordinary
- 13 course of its business, makes telephones available to the public
- 14 or to transient users of its business, including, but not
- 15 <u>limited to, a hotel, motel, hospital or university, and that</u>
- 16 provides operator-assisted services through an alternative
- 17 operator service provider.
- 18 "Alternative operator service provider." A nonfacilities
- 19 based carrier that is a reseller, that leases lines from local
- 20 <u>exchange carriers and interexchange carriers and using these</u>
- 21 <u>leased facilities along with their own operators, provides</u>
- 22 operator-assisted service.
- 23 "Certificated interLATA telephone service provider." Any
- 24 public utility which is certificated by the commission to
- 25 provide interLATA toll service in this Commonwealth and provides
- 26 service primarily through facilities it owns or leases.
- 27 <u>"Coin telephone." A telephone which requires insertion of a</u>
- 28 coin as a charge for using the telephone to make local or long
- 29 <u>distance calls.</u>
- 30 "Operator-assisted service." Any telephone call which the

- customer initiates by dialing "0" and for which a fee is 1
- 2 charged. These services may be provided by either human or
- 3 <u>mechanical operators and include</u>, but are not limited to, all
- 4 <u>calls billed to credit cards or third parties and all collect or</u>
- 5 <u>person-to-person calls.</u>
- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days. 6
