AN ACT

Amending the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), entitled "An act relating to dogs, regulating the keeping of dogs; providing for the licensing of dogs and kennels; providing for the protection of dogs and the detention and destruction of dogs in certain cases; regulating the sale and transportation of dogs; declaring dogs to be personal property and the subject of theft; providing for the assessment of damages done to livestock, poultry and domestic game birds; providing for payment of damages by the Commonwealth in certain cases and the liability of the owner or keeper of dogs for such damages; imposing powers and duties on certain State and local officers and employees; providing penalties; and creating a Dog Law Restricted Account," establishing a program to reimburse the costs of neutering dogs and cats; establishing an ongoing educational program to inform the public of pet overpopulation; creating the Pet Overpopulation Fund; and imposing a tax on dog and cat food.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. The act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225),
known as the Dog Law, is amended by adding a section to read:
Section 1003. Pet Overpopulation Fund; neutering and
educational program.
(a) Pet Overpopulation Fund.--There is hereby established a
restricted account within the department to be known as the Pet Overpopulation Fund.
(b) Funding.--A 1c per pound surcharge shall be imposed on all dog and cat food for sale at wholesale for consumption in this Commonwealth. This surcharge shall be paid by the purchaser and shall be forwarded directly to the State Treasurer for transfer to the Pet Overpopulation Fund. Any interest earned shall remain with the fund.
(c) Appropriation.--As much as may be necessary of the moneys in the Pet Overpopulation Fund is hereby appropriated to pay:
(1) All salaries of the employees of the department in administering their duties under this act.
(2) All expenses of the secretary and the department in administering their duties under this act.
(3) Reimbursements to pet owners for operations performed by veterinarians to neuter their pets at the following rates:
(i) For cat neuters - $\$ 8$.
(ii) For cat spays - $\$ 12$.
(iii) For dog neuters - \$15.
(iv) For dog spays - \$20.
(4) Ongoing educational programs to inform pet owners and potential pet owners of the consequences of pet overpopulation.
(d) Regulations.--The secretary shall promulgate rules and regulations governing procedures, forms and reimbursement details within 60 days of passage.

Section 2. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
