## AN ACT

1	Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled
2	"An act concerning elections, including general, municipal,
<i>3</i>	special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, primary and election expenses and election contests; creating
5	and defining membership of county boards of elections;
6	imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth,
7	courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners;
8 9	imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and
10	repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to
11	elections, " providing for the modernization of election
12	equipment upon the approval of the electors of counties; and
13	providing for grants to counties for a portion of the cost.
14	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
15	hereby enacts as follows:
16	Section 1. The act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known
17	as the Pennsylvania Election Code, is amended by adding an
18	article to read:
19	ARTICLE XVII-A
20	Modernization of Election Equipment
21	Section 1701-A. Authorization of Modernizing Election
22	Equipment Any county may, by a majority vote of its qualified

- 1 registered electors voting thereon, cast at any primary or
- 2 <u>election</u>, authorize and direct the county board of elections to
- 3 modernize the election equipment of the county.
- 4 <u>Section 1702-A. Placing Modernization Question on Ballot.--</u>
- 5 (a) The county election board may, upon their own motion, or
- 6 shall, upon the filing of a petition with them signed by
- 7 <u>qualified electors of the county equal in number to at least ten</u>
- 8 (10) per centum of the total number of electors who voted in the
- 9 county at the preceding general or municipal election, submit to
- 10 the qualified registered electors of the county, at the next
- 11 primary or election, the question "Shall the election equipment
- 12 of the county of be modernized?"
- (b) The county board shall cause the said question to be
- 14 submitted at the primary or election, in accordance with the
- 15 provisions of this act relating to elections.
- 16 (c) The election on said question shall be held at the
- 17 places, during the hours, and under the regulations, provided by
- 18 law for holding primaries and elections, and shall be conducted
- 19 by the election officers provided by law to conduct such
- 20 <u>elections</u>. The election officers shall count the votes cast at
- 21 the elections on said question, and shall make return thereof to
- 22 the county election board of the county, as required by law.
- 23 Said returns shall be computed by the county election board, or
- 24 other return board, and, when so computed, a certificate of the
- 25 total number of electors voting "Yes" and of the total number of
- 26 <u>electors voting "No" on such question shall be filed in the</u>
- 27 office of the county election board, and copies thereof,
- 28 certified by the county election board, shall forthwith be
- 29 <u>furnished to the Secretary of the Commonwealth and to the county</u>
- 30 commissioners or other appropriate authority of the county.

- 1 (d) If a majority of the electors of any county voting on
- 2 <u>such question shall vote against the modernization of election</u>
- 3 equipment, the question shall not again be submitted to the
- 4 voters of such county within a period of one hundred three
- 5 weeks.
- 6 (e) Whenever, under the provisions of this act, the question
- 7 of the modernization of election equipment is to be submitted to
- 8 the electors of any county, the county board of elections shall
- 9 <u>publicize</u> and, to the best of its ability, inform the electors
- 10 of the county of the need for and nature of the proposed
- 11 modernization, and inform the electors that fifty (50) per
- 12 centum of the approved cost thereof will be paid to the county
- 13 by a grant from the Commonwealth.
- 14 Section 1703-A. Action on Approval by Electors.--If a
- 15 majority of the qualified registered electors voting on the
- 16 question in any county vote in favor of the modernization of
- 17 election equipment, the county board of elections of that county
- 18 shall prepare a plan describing the modernization of election
- 19 equipment it proposes to undertake in such form and with such
- 20 explanation as may be required by the Secretary of the
- 21 Commonwealth and submit the plan together with an application
- 22 for a grant for payment of a portion of the cost thereof to the
- 23 <u>Secretary of the Commonwealth. The application shall be made on</u>
- 24 a form prepared and furnished by the Secretary of the
- 25 Commonwealth.
- 26 <u>Section 1704-A. Grants.--Upon application from a county, the</u>
- 27 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall award to the county a grant
- 28 <u>in the amount of fifty (50) per centum of the cost of projects</u>
- 29 for modernization of election equipment set forth in the plan
- 30 which is approved by the secretary.

- 1 <u>Section 1705-A. Modernization.--Upon receipt of a grant as</u>
- 2 provided for in section 1704-A, the county board of elections
- 3 shall promptly undertake the approved projects for modernization
- 4 of election equipment. The portion of the cost of modernization
- 5 of election equipment beyond the grant received from the
- 6 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall be borne by the county.
- 7 Section 2. The sum of \$30,000,000, or as much thereof as may
- 8 be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of State
- 9 for use by the Secretary of the Commonwealth in making grants
- 10 authorized by this act.
- 11 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
