A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth
2 of Pennsylvania, providing for a maximum number of terms of
3 office for members of the General Assembly.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby resolves as follows:

6 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7 Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:

8 That section 3 of Article II be amended to read:

9 § 3. Terms of members.

10 Senators shall be elected for the term of four years and
11 Representatives for the term of [two] four years. Senators shall
12 not be eligible for election to more than four full consecutive
13 terms of office. Representatives shall not be eligible for
14 election to more than four full consecutive terms of office.

15 Section 2. The amendment proposed in section 1 shall not
16 apply to members of the General Assembly holding office on the
17 effective date of the amendment.
