14	1971 (P.L.104, No.3), known as the Senior Citizens Rebate and
15	Assistance Act, reenacted and amended December 21, 1979
16	(P.L.570, No.131) and amended March 10, 1982 (P.L.177, No.56),

- 6 Section 2. Declaration of Policy. -- In recognition of the
- 7 severe economic plight of certain senior citizens, widows,
- 8 widowers, divorced persons and permanently disabled persons who
- 9 are real property owners or renters with fixed and limited
- 10 incomes who are faced with rising living costs and constantly
- 11 increasing tax and inflation cost burdens which threaten their
- 12 homesteads and self-sufficiency, the General Assembly, pursuant
- 13 to the mandates of the Constitutional Convention of 1968,
- 14 considers it to be a matter of sound public policy to make
- 15 special provisions for property tax rebates or rent rebates in
- 16 lieu of property taxes and inflation dividends to that class of
- 17 senior citizens, widows, widowers and permanently disabled
- 18 persons who are real property taxpayers or renters who are
- 19 without adequate means of support to enable them to remain in
- 20 peaceable possession of their homes and relieving their economic
- 21 burden and to provide transportation assistance grants and to
- 22 provide grants to area agencies on aging for services to older
- 23 persons.

- 27 Section 3. Definitions.--As used in this act:

- 29 (7) "Claimant" means a person who files a claim for property
- 30 tax rebate or rent rebate in lieu of property taxes and

- 1 inflation dividend and:
- 2 (i) was sixty-five years of age or over, or whose spouse (if
- 3 a member of the household) was sixty-five years of age or over,
- 4 during a calendar year in which real property taxes, rent and
- 5 inflation costs were due and payable [or];
- 6 (ii) was a widow or widower and was fifty years of age or
- 7 over during a calendar year or part thereof in which real
- 8 property taxes, rent and inflation costs were due and payable[,
- 9 or];
- 10 (iii) was a divorced person and was sixty years of age or
- 11 over during a calendar year or part thereof in which real
- 12 property taxes, rent and inflation costs were due and payable;
- 13 <u>or</u>
- 14 (iv) was a permanently disabled person eighteen years of age
- 15 or over during a calendar year or part thereof in which real
- 16 property taxes, rent and inflation costs were due and payable.
- 17 [For the purposes of this act the term "widow" or "widower"
- 18 shall mean the surviving wife or the surviving husband, as the
- 19 case may be, of a deceased individual and who has not remarried
- 20 except as provided in subsection (c) and (d) of section 4 of
- 21 this act. For the purposes of this act the term "permanently
- 22 disabled person" shall mean a person who is unable to engage in
- 23 any substantial gainful activity by reason of any medically
- 24 determinable physical or mental impairment which can be expected
- 25 to continue indefinitely, except as provided in subsection (c)
- 26 and (d) of section 4 of this act.]

- 28 (10) "Widow" or "widower" means the surviving unremarried
- 29 wife or the surviving unremarried husband, as the case may be,
- 30 of a deceased individual, except as provided in subsections (c)

- 1 and (d) of section 4.
- 2 (11) "Divorced person" means a formerly married person whose
- 3 marriage was terminated by court order, who has not remarried
- 4 and whose sole source of income is from the former spouse under
- 5 an agreement or court order relating to the divorce, except as
- 6 provided in subsections (c) and (d) of section 4.
- 7 (12) "Permanently disabled persons" means a person who is
- 8 unable to engage in any substantial gainful activity by reason
- 9 of a medically determinable physical or mental impairment which
- 10 can be expected to continue indefinitely, except as provided in
- 11 <u>subsections (c) and (d) of section 4.</u>
- 12 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
