## A RESOLUTION

1 Memorializing the Governor to proclaim the week of April 30  
2 through May 6, 1989, as "Days of Remembrance of the Victims  
3 of the Holocaust."

4 WHEREAS, From 1933 to 1945, six million Jews were murdered in  
5 the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide,  
6 and millions of other people perished as victims of Nazism; and

7 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should always  
8 remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such  
9 horrors never be repeated and should continually rededicate  
10 themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and

11 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should remain  
12 eternally vigilant against all tyranny and recognize that  
13 bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and

1       WHEREAS, May 2 has been designated internationally as a Day  
2 of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust, known as Yom  
3 Hashoah; and

4       WHEREAS, It is appropriate for the people of this  
5 Commonwealth to join in the international commemoration;  
6 therefore be it

7       RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives memorialize the  
8 Governor to proclaim the week of April 30 through May 6, 1989,  
9 as the "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust" in  
10 memory of the victims of the Holocaust, and in the hope that we  
11 will strive always to overcome prejudice and inhumanity through  
12 education, vigilance and resistance.
