A RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing the Governor to proclaim the week of April 22
- through April 28, 1990, as the "Days of Remembrance of the
- 3 Victims of the Holocaust."
- 4 WHEREAS, From 1933 to 1945, six million Jews were murdered in
- 5 the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic program of genocide,
- 6 and millions of other people perished as victims of Nazism; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should always
- 8 remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such
- 9 horrors shall never be repeated, and should continually
- 10 rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all
- 11 people; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should remain
- 13 eternally vigilant against all tyranny and should recognize that
- 14 bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Jewish Coalition in March 1990
- 2 published "The Holocaust--A Guide for Pennsylvania Teachers," in
- 3 cooperation with the Pennsylvania Department of Education; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Publications of this type are useful and important
- 5 tools to educate our teachers and their students in eliminating
- 6 the prejudice and bigotry which leads to discrimination,
- 7 persecution, and ultimately, to genocide; and
- 8 WHEREAS, April 22, 1990, has been designated internationally
- 9 as "Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust," known
- 10 as Yom Hashoah; and
- 11 WHEREAS, It is appropriate for the people of this
- 12 Commonwealth to join in the international commemoration;
- 13 therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 15 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize Governor Robert P.
- 16 Casey to proclaim the week of April 22 through April 28, 1990,
- 17 as the "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust," in
- 18 memory of the victims of the Holocaust, and in the hope that we
- 19 will strive always to overcome prejudice and inhumanity through
- 20 education, vigilance and resistance; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives memorialize the
- 22 Governor to support the promotion and distribution of "The
- 23 Holocaust--A Guide for Pennsylvania Teachers" in schools of the
- 24 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
