AN ACT

Amending the act of February 1, 1966 (1965 P.L.1656, No.581), 2 entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending 3 and consolidating the law relating to boroughs, " further providing for the awarding of contracts. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Subsection (a) and the first paragraph and clause (2) of subsection (d) of section 1402, and sections 1403 and 1405, of the act of February 1, 1966 (1965 P.L.1656, No.581), known as The Borough Code, amended December 22, 1981 (P.L.537, 10 No.155), are amended AND FEBRUARY 14, 1990 (P.L.60, NO.10), ARE 11 12 AMENDED AND THE SECTION IS AMENDED BY ADDING SUBSECTIONS to 13 read: Section 1402. Regulation of Contracts. (a) All contracts 14 15 or purchases in excess of [four thousand dollars (\$4,000)] ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), except those hereinafter mentioned, 16

shall not be made except with and from the lowest responsible

- 1 bidder after due notice in one newspaper of general circulation
- 2 in the borough, at least three times at intervals of not less
- 3 than three days where daily newspapers of general circulation
- 4 are available for such publication, in case of weekly
- 5 newspapers, such notice once a week for two successive weeks.
- 6 The first advertisement shall be published not less than ten
- 7 days prior to the date fixed for the opening of bids. The amount
- 8 of the contract shall in all cases, whether of straight sale
- 9 price, conditional sale, bailment lease, or otherwise, be the
- 10 entire amount which the borough pays to the successful bidder or
- 11 his assigns in order to obtain the services or property, or
- 12 both, and shall not be construed to mean only the amount which
- 13 is paid to acquire title or to receive any other particular
- 14 benefit or benefits of the whole bargain. In awarding bids,
- 15 council shall have the right to take into consideration such
- 16 other factors as the availability, cost and quality of service.
- 17 SECTION 1402. REGULATION OF CONTRACTS.--(A) ALL CONTRACTS

- 18 OR PURCHASES IN EXCESS OF [FOUR THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$4,000)] THE
- 19 MONETARY THRESHOLD LEVEL FOR THE BOROUGH, EXCEPT THOSE
- 20 HEREINAFTER MENTIONED, SHALL NOT BE MADE EXCEPT WITH AND FROM
- 21 THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER AFTER DUE NOTICE IN ONE NEWSPAPER
- 22 OF GENERAL CIRCULATION IN THE BOROUGH, AT LEAST TWO TIMES AT
- 23 INTERVALS OF NOT LESS THAN THREE DAYS WHERE DAILY NEWSPAPERS OF
- 24 GENERAL CIRCULATION ARE AVAILABLE FOR SUCH PUBLICATION, IN CASE
- 25 OF WEEKLY NEWSPAPERS, SUCH NOTICE ONCE A WEEK FOR TWO SUCCESSIVE
- 26 WEEKS. THE FIRST ADVERTISEMENT SHALL BE PUBLISHED NOT MORE THAN
- 27 FORTY-FIVE DAYS AND THE SECOND ADVERTISEMENT NOT LESS THAN TEN
- 28 DAYS PRIOR TO THE DATE FIXED FOR THE OPENING OF BIDS.
- 29 ADVERTISEMENTS FOR CONTRACTS OR PURCHASES SHALL ALSO BE POSTED
- 30 IN A CONSPICUOUS PLACE WITHIN THE BOROUGH. THE AMOUNT OF THE

- 1 CONTRACT SHALL IN ALL CASES, WHETHER OF STRAIGHT SALE PRICE,
- 2 CONDITIONAL SALE, BAILMENT LEASE, OR OTHERWISE, BE THE ENTIRE
- 3 AMOUNT WHICH THE BOROUGH PAYS TO THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER OR HIS
- 4 ASSIGNS IN ORDER TO OBTAIN THE SERVICES OR PROPERTY, OR BOTH,
- 5 AND SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO MEAN ONLY THE AMOUNT WHICH IS PAID
- 6 TO ACQUIRE TITLE OR TO RECEIVE ANY OTHER PARTICULAR BENEFIT OR
- 7 BENEFITS OF THE WHOLE BARGAIN. IN AWARDING BIDS, COUNCIL SHALL
- 8 HAVE THE RIGHT TO TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION SUCH OTHER FACTORS AS
- 9 THE AVAILABILITY, COST AND QUALITY OF SERVICE.
- 10 (A.1) THE MONETARY THRESHOLD LEVEL ABOVE WHICH COMPETITIVE
- 11 BIDDING SHALL BE REQUIRED SHALL BE ONE PER CENTUM (1%) OF THE
- 12 TOTAL OF ALL BUDGETS ADMINISTERED BY THE BOROUGH, BUT IN NO CASE
- 13 SHALL THE MONETARY THRESHOLD BE LESS THAN FOUR THOUSAND DOLLARS
- 14 (\$4,000), NOR MORE THAN TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000).
- 15 (A.2) WRITTEN OR TELEPHONIC PRICE QUOTATIONS FROM AT LEAST
- 16 THREE QUALIFIED AND RESPONSIBLE CONTRACTORS SHALL BE REQUESTED
- 17 FOR ALL CONTRACTS THAT EXCEED FOUR THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$4,000) BUT
- 18 ARE LESS THAN THE AMOUNT REQUIRING ADVERTISEMENT AND COMPETITIVE
- 19 BIDDING OR, IN LIEU OF PRICE QUOTATIONS, A MEMORANDUM SHALL BE
- 20 KEPT ON FILE SHOWING THAT FEWER THAN THREE QUALIFIED CONTRACTORS
- 21 EXIST IN THE MARKET AREA WITHIN WHICH IT IS PRACTICABLE TO
- 22 OBTAIN QUOTATIONS. A WRITTEN RECORD OF TELEPHONIC PRICE
- 23 QUOTATIONS SHALL BE MADE AND SHALL CONTAIN AT LEAST THE DATE OF
- 24 THE QUOTATION, THE NAME OF THE CONTRACTOR AND THE CONTRACTOR'S
- 25 REPRESENTATIVE, THE CONSTRUCTION, RECONSTRUCTION, REPAIR,
- 26 MAINTENANCE OR WORK WHICH WAS THE SUBJECT OF THE QUOTATION AND
- 27 THE PRICE. WRITTEN PRICE QUOTATIONS, WRITTEN RECORDS OF
- 28 TELEPHONIC PRICE QUOTATIONS AND MEMORANDA SHALL BE RETAINED FOR
- 29 <u>A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS.</u>
- 30 * * *

1 The contracts or purchases made by council, involving an 2 expenditure of over [four thousand dollars (\$4,000)] ten 3 thousand dollars (\$10,000) THE MONETARY THRESHOLD LEVEL FOR THE 4 BOROUGH, which shall not require advertising or bidding as 5 hereinbefore provided, are as follows: 6 (2) Those made for improvements, repairs and maintenance of 7 any kind, made or provided by any borough, through its own 8 9 employes: Provided, That all materials used for street 10 improvement, maintenance and/or construction in excess of [four 11 thousand dollars (\$4,000)] ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) THE 12 MONETARY THRESHOLD LEVEL FOR THE BOROUGH be subject to the 13 advertising requirements contained herein; * * * 14 15 SECTION 2. SECTIONS 1403 AND 1405 OF THE ACT, AMENDED 16 DECEMBER 22, 1981 (P.L.537, NO.155), ARE AMENDED TO READ: 17 Section 1403. Evasion of Advertising Requirements. -- No 18 member or members of council shall evade the provisions of 19 section 1402 hereof as to advertising for bids, by purchasing or 20 contracting for services and personal properties piecemeal for 21 the purpose of obtaining prices under [four thousand dollars 22 (\$4,000)] ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) THE MONETARY THRESHOLD 23 LEVEL FOR THE BOROUGH upon transactions, which transactions 24 should, in the exercise of reasonable discretion and prudence, 25 be conducted as one transaction amounting to more than [four 26 thousand dollars (\$4,000)] ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) THE 27 MONETARY THRESHOLD LEVEL FOR THE BOROUGH. This provision is 28 intended to make unlawful the evading of advertising 29 requirements by making a series of purchases or contracts, each 30 for less than the advertising requirement price, or by making

- 1 several simultaneous purchases or contracts, each below said
- 2 price, when, in either case, the transactions involved should
- 3 have been made as one transaction for one price. Any members of
- 4 council who so vote in violation of this provision and who know
- 5 that the transaction upon which they so vote is or ought to be a
- 6 part of a larger transaction and that it is being divided in
- 7 order to evade the requirements as to advertising for bids,
- 8 shall be jointly and severally subject to surcharge for ten
- 9 percent of the full amount of the contract or purchase. Whenever
- 10 it shall appear that a member of council may have voted in
- 11 violation of this section but the purchase or contract on which
- 12 he so voted was not approved by council, this section shall be
- 13 inapplicable.
- 14 Section 1405. Separate Bids for Plumbing, Heating,
- 15 Ventilating and Electrical Work. -- In the preparation for the
- 16 erection, construction and alteration of any public building,
- 17 when the entire cost of such work shall exceed [four thousand
- 18 dollars (\$4,000)] ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) THE MONETARY

- 19 THRESHOLD LEVEL FOR THE BOROUGH, the architect, engineer, or
- 20 other person preparing such specifications may, if so requested
- 21 by the borough council, prepare separate specifications for the
- 22 plumbing, heating, ventilating and electrical work. The person
- 23 or persons authorized to enter into contracts for the erection,
- 24 construction or alteration of such public buildings may, if such
- 25 separate specifications shall have been proposed, receive
- 26 separate bids upon each of the said branches of work and shall
- 27 thereupon award the contract for the same to the lowest
- 28 responsible bidder for each of said branches.
- 29 Section $\frac{2}{3}$. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
