AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as  
2 reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and  
3 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating  
4 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and  
5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession,  
6 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding  
7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic  
8 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the  
9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and  
10 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing  
11 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores,  
12 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective  
13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain  
14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure  
15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures;  
16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws,"  
17 further providing for the issuance of extended hours food  
18 licenses.

19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
20 hereby enacts as follows:

21 Section 1. Section 499(b) of the act of April 12, 1951  
22 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended  
23 June 29, 1987 (P.L.32, No.14) and added December 7, 1990  
24 (P.L.622, No.160), is amended to read:

25 Section 499. Premises to be Vacated by Patrons.--\* \* \*

1 (b) A licensee may serve food between the hours of two  
2 o'clock antemeridian and seven o'clock antemeridian on any day  
3 if such licensee either possesses or is eligible to purchase a  
4 Sunday Sales Permit [in accordance with section 406 (relating to  
5 sales by liquor licensees, restrictions)], and receives an  
6 extended hours food license. The board shall establish an annual  
7 fee for the extended hours food license which shall not exceed  
8 fifty dollars (\$50).

9 \* \* \*

10 Section 2. This act shall be retroactive to February 19,  
11 1991.

12 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
