22 SECTION 101. SHORT TITLE.--THIS ACT SHALL BE KNOWN AND MAY  
23 BE CITED AS THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF 1992.

7 REPAIRS, FREIGHT, EXPRESS AND CARTAGE, POSTAGE, TELEPHONES AND  
8 TELEGRAPH RENTALS AND TOLL CHARGES, NEWSPAPER ADVERTISING AND  
9 NOTICES, PUBLIC ADVERTISING BY OR THROUGH ANY MEDIUM, FUEL,  
10 LIGHT, HEAT, POWER AND WATER, MINOR CONSTRUCTION AND RENOVATION,  
11 REPAIRS OR RECONSTRUCTION OF EQUIPMENT, BUILDINGS AND  
12 FACILITIES, RENT OF REAL ESTATE AND EQUIPMENT, PREMIUMS ON  
13 WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION, INSURANCE PREMIUMS ON POLICIES OF  
14 LIABILITY INSURANCE, INSURANCE PREMIUMS ON MEDICAL PAYMENT  
15 INSURANCE AND SURETY BONDS FOR VOLUNTEER WORKERS, PREMIUMS ON  
16 EMPLOYEE GROUP LIFE INSURANCE AND EMPLOYEE AND RETIRED EMPLOYEE  
17 GROUP HOSPITAL AND MEDICAL INSURANCE, PAYMENT OF COMMONWEALTH  
18 SHARE OF SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES AND UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION  
19 COSTS FOR STATE EMPLOYEES, THE PURCHASE OF REPLACEMENT OR  
20 ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY AND ALL OTHER INCIDENTAL  
21 COSTS AND EXPENSES, INCLUDING PAYMENT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
22 GENERAL SERVICES OF MILEAGE AND OTHER CHARGES FOR THE USE OF  
23 AUTOMOBILES AND RENTAL PAYMENTS FOR PERMANENTLY ASSIGNED  
24 AUTOMOBILES AND OF EXPENSES OR COSTS OF SERVICES INCURRED  
25 THROUGH THE PURCHASING FUND. THE TERM "EXPENSES" ALSO SHALL  
26 INCLUDE THE MEDICAL COSTS FOR THE TREATMENT OF INMATES OF STATE  
27 INSTITUTIONS WHEN THE INMATE MUST BE TRANSFERRED TO AN OUTSIDE  
28 HOSPITAL: PROVIDED, THAT IN NO CASE SHALL THE STATE INSTITUTION  
29 PAY MORE FOR PATIENT CARE THAN THAT PROVIDED UNDER THE STATE  
30 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

7 NATURAL DISASTERS OR CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE MAY BE ADDED TO AN  
8 APPROPRIATION CONTAINED IN THIS ACT OR TO FUNDS APPROPRIATED OR  
9 MAY BE USED FOR THE PURPOSES PRESCRIBED BY THE FEDERAL  
10 GOVERNMENT.

11 (B) IN ADDITION TO THE MONEYS APPROPRIATED BY THIS ACT, ALL  
12 MONEYS RECEIVED FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF  
13 DISASTER ASSISTANCE OR RELIEF SHALL BE PAID INTO THE GENERAL  
14 FUND AND ARE HEREBY APPROPRIATED OUT OF THE GENERAL FUND TO THE  
15 DEPARTMENTS, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS OR AGENCIES DESIGNATED BY THE  
16 GOVERNOR.

17 (C) IN THE EVENT OF ANY EMERGENCY SITUATION IN WHICH THE  
18 GENERAL ASSEMBLY CANNOT ACT IN SUFFICIENT TIME, THE GOVERNOR IS  
19 AUTHORIZED THROUGH EXECUTIVE AUTHORIZATION TO PROVIDE UP TO  
20 \$5,000,000 IN FEDERAL FUNDS TO ALLEVIATE THE EMERGENCY  
21 SITUATION. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "EMERGENCY" IS  
22 DEFINED AS ANY SITUATION IN WHICH THERE IS A CHANCE OF OR WHICH  
23 MAY RESULT IN SUBSTANTIAL HUMAN SUFFERING.

24 PART XV

25 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

26 SECTION 1501. PRIOR LAWS UNAFFECTED.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN  
27 SECTION 253, THIS ACT IS NOT INTENDED TO BE INCONSISTENT WITH OR  
28 TO REPEAL ANY PROVISION OF ANY ACT ENACTED AT THIS OR ANY PRIOR  
29 SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGULATING THE PURCHASE OF  
30 SUPPLIES, THE ORDERING OF PRINTING AND BINDING, THE PURCHASE,

1 MAINTENANCE AND USE OF AUTOMOBILES, THE METHOD OF MAKING  
2 PAYMENTS FROM THE STATE TREASURY FOR ANY PURPOSE OR THE  
3 FUNCTIONING OF ANY ADMINISTRATIVE DEPARTMENT, BOARD OR  
4 COMMISSION.

5 SECTION 1502. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAW BEFORE FUNDS  
6 AVAILABLE.--NO APPROPRIATION MADE BY THIS ACT TO ANY DEPARTMENT,  
7 BOARD, COMMISSION OR AGENCY OF THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE  
8 AVAILABLE UNLESS AND UNTIL THE DEPARTMENT, BOARD, COMMISSION OR  
9 AGENCY HAS COMPLIED WITH SECTIONS 615 AND 616 OF THE ACT OF  
10 APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.177, NO.175), KNOWN AS THE ADMINISTRATIVE  
11 CODE OF 1929.

12 SECTION 1503. CONTRACTS PREREQUISITE TO ENCUMBERING OR  
13 COMMITTING FUNDS.--FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF SUPPLIES, MATERIALS  
14 AND EQUIPMENT SHALL NOT BE DEEMED TO BE COMMITTED OR ENCUMBERED  
15 UNTIL CONTRACTS COVERING THE PURCHASE HAVE BEEN ENTERED INTO  
16 WITH THE VENDORS.

17 SECTION 1504. MINORITY BUSINESS SET-ASIDES.--(A) EACH  
18 DEPARTMENT OR OTHER INSTRUMENTALITY OF THE COMMONWEALTH LISTED  
19 IN SUBPART A OF PART II, AUTHORIZED TO CONTRACT FOR BUILDINGS,  
20 HIGHWAYS, COMMODITIES, EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES OR SERVICES, SHALL  
21 REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ALL INFORMATION PERTINENT TO  
22 ANTICIPATED PROCUREMENT NEEDS AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH FISCAL  
23 YEAR AND EACH FISCAL QUARTER THEREAFTER.

24 (B) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERM "MINORITY BUSINESS"  
25 MEANS A MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE AS DEFINED IN THE ACT OF  
26 JULY 22, 1974 (P.L.598, NO.206), KNOWN AS THE PENNSYLVANIA  
27 MINORITY BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ACT.

28 SECTION 1505. APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FROM MISCELLANEOUS  
29 SOURCES.--(A) IN ADDITION TO THE AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED BY THIS  
30 ACT, MONEYS RECEIVED IN PAYMENT FOR FOOD AND HOUSEHOLD SUPPLIES

1 FURNISHED TO EMPLOYEES AND OTHER PERSONS, EXCEPT INMATES, BY AN  
2 INSTITUTION, AND MONEYS RECEIVED FROM THE PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE  
3 OF ANY PRODUCTS OF THE SOIL, MEATS, LIVESTOCK, TIMBER OR OTHER  
4 MATERIALS SOLD BY THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE PAID INTO THE GENERAL  
5 FUND AND ARE HEREBY APPROPRIATED OUT OF THE GENERAL FUND TO THE  
6 SEVERAL RESPECTIVE INSTITUTIONS FOR THE OPERATION AND  
7 MAINTENANCE OF THE INSTITUTIONS.

8 (B) IN ADDITION TO THE AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED BY THIS ACT, ALL  
9 MONEYS RECEIVED FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE, EXCEPT THE FEDERAL  
10 GOVERNMENT, AS CONTRIBUTIONS FOR THE PROGRAMS PROVIDED HEREIN OR  
11 AS PAYMENT FOR SERVICES OR MATERIALS FURNISHED BY ONE  
12 INSTITUTION TO ANOTHER, EXCEPT THOSE COLLECTIONS DESIGNATED AS  
13 REVENUES, SHALL BE PAID INTO THE GENERAL FUND AND ARE HEREBY  
14 APPROPRIATED OUT OF THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE  
15 RESPECTIVE APPROPRIATIONS.

16 (C) IN ADDITION TO ANY FUNDS SPECIFICALLY APPROPRIATED BY  
17 THIS ACT, ALL MONEYS RECEIVED BY A DEPARTMENT OR AGENCY OF THE  
18 COMMONWEALTH FROM ANY OTHER SOURCES, EXCEPT THE FEDERAL  
19 GOVERNMENT, AS CONTRIBUTIONS OR SUPPLEMENTS TO THE DEPARTMENT OR  
20 AGENCY FOR A PROGRAM OR ADMINISTRATION OF AN ACT INCLUDED IN  
21 THIS ACT SHALL BE PAID INTO THE GENERAL FUND AND CREDITED TO THE  
22 APPROPRIATION FOR THAT PROGRAM OR ADMINISTRATION OF THE ACT.

23 SECTION 1506. LAPSING OF UNUSED FUNDS.--(A) EXCEPT AS  
24 OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW OR IN THIS SECTION, THAT PART OF ALL  
25 APPROPRIATIONS IN PARTS II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X AND  
26 XI UNEXPENDED, UNCOMMITTED OR UNENCUMBERED AS OF JUNE 30, 1993,  
27 SHALL AUTOMATICALLY LAPSE AS OF THAT DATE.

28 (B) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART II TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
29 COMMERCE FOR BIOTECHNOLOGY RESEARCH SHALL BE A TWO-YEAR  
30 CONTINUING APPROPRIATION.

1 (C) THE APPROPRIATIONS IN PART II TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
2 COMMUNITY AFFAIRS FOR HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE AND  
3 ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT SHALL BE TWO-YEAR CONTINUING  
4 APPROPRIATIONS.

5 (D) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART II TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
6 EDUCATION FOR JTPA MATCHING FUNDS SHALL BE A TWO-YEAR CONTINUING  
7 APPROPRIATION.

8 (E) THE APPROPRIATIONS IN PART II TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
9 ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES FOR THE CHESAPEAKE BAY POLLUTION  
10 ABATEMENT PROGRAM, THE BLACK FLY CONTROL PROGRAM AND THE  
11 UTILITIES AT HUNTINGDON, CRESSON, FRACKVILLE AND GRATERFORD  
12 STATE CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS SHALL BE TWO-YEAR CONTINUING  
13 APPROPRIATIONS.

14 (F) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART II TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
15 GENERAL SERVICES FOR PRINTING OF THE PENNSYLVANIA MANUAL SHALL  
16 BE A TWO-YEAR CONTINUING APPROPRIATION.

17 (G) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART II TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
18 MILITARY AFFAIRS FOR THE VETERANS' MEMORIAL COMMISSION SHALL BE  
19 A TWO-YEAR CONTINUING APPROPRIATION.

20 (H) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART II TO THE PENNSYLVANIA HIGHER  
21 EDUCATION ASSISTANCE AGENCY FOR URBAN AND RURAL LOAN FORGIVENESS  
22 SHALL BE A TWO-YEAR CONTINUING APPROPRIATION.

23 (I) THE APPROPRIATIONS IN PART II TO THE LEGISLATIVE  
24 DEPARTMENT SHALL BE CONTINUING APPROPRIATIONS.

25 (J) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART IV TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
26 COMMUNITY AFFAIRS FOR THE RECREATION IMPROVEMENT AND  
27 REHABILITATION ACT SHALL BE A THREE-YEAR CONTINUING  
28 APPROPRIATION.

29 (K) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART IV TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
30 COMMUNITY AFFAIRS FOR HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT ECONOMIC SET-

1 ASIDE SHALL BE A TWO-YEAR CONTINUING APPROPRIATION.

2 (L) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART IV TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR  
3 AND INDUSTRY FOR THE PENNSYLVANIA CONSERVATION CORPS SHALL BE A  
4 TWO-YEAR CONTINUING APPROPRIATION.

5 (M) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART IV TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
6 COMMERCE FOR BUSINESS INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT SHALL BE A TWO-  
7 YEAR CONTINUING APPROPRIATION.

8 (N) THE APPROPRIATION IN PART V TO THE PENNSYLVANIA ENERGY  
9 OFFICE SHALL BE A TWO-YEAR CONTINUING APPROPRIATION.

10 (O) THE APPROPRIATIONS IN SECTION 921 OF PART IX FOR AIRPORT  
11 DEVELOPMENT, RUNWAY REHABILITATION, BUSINESS AIRPORT GRANTS AND  
12 REAL ESTATE TAX REBATE PAYMENTS SHALL BE TWO-YEAR CONTINUING  
13 APPROPRIATIONS.

14 SECTION 1507. ADDITIONAL LAPSE OF FUNDS.--ALL MONEYS  
15 APPROPRIATED TO AND UNEXPENDED OR UNENCUMBERED BY THE  
16 COMMONWEALTH COMMISSION ON THE BICENTENNIAL OF THE CONSTITUTION  
17 OF THE UNITED STATES IN SECTION 263 OF THE ACT OF JULY 3, 1987  
18 (P.L.459, NO.9A), KNOWN AS THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF  
19 1987, SHALL LAPSE IMMEDIATELY.

22 SECTION 1601. EFFECTIVE DATE.--THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT  
23 JULY 1, 1992, OR, IF ENACTED SUBSEQUENTLY, IMMEDIATELY.
