$ \begin{array}{c} 1\\2\\3\\4\\5\\6\\7\\8\\9\\10\\11\\2\\13\\14\\5\\16\\17\\18\end{array} $	Το	the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State- related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

21		Section 1. $(a)$ The following sums, or as much thereof as
22	may	y be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the

23 University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to

24 June 30, 1992, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

15	(b) The appropriation in subsection (a)(1) shall be	<—		
16	contingent upon any 1991-1992 academic tuition increases for			
17	undergraduate, Pennsylvania resident students not exceeding 6%			
18	or \$100, whichever is greater. The final payment totaling no			
19	less than 25% of this appropriation is contingent on the			
20	Secretary of Education certifying to the General Assembly that			
21	the University of Pittsburgh has fully cooperated in the			
22	Department of Education's efforts to fulfill the requirements of			
23	the higher education accountability appropriation to the			
24	Department of Education.			
25	Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on			
26	account of the appropriations for all items as provided in			
27	section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal			
28	year.			
29	Section 3. If necessary, the University of Pittsburgh may			
30	transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1(1)			

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and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or
 out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not
 exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that
 purpose.

5 Section 4. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of 6 the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly 7 during the fiscal year.

8 (b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with 9 the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The 10 estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of 11 Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly 12 and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date 13 on which such payment is to be made.

14 Section 5. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the 15 moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are 16 permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 17 18 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file, with the 19 20 Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each 21 22 branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and 23 purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by 24 this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, 25 as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any 26 appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes 19910H1552B2346 - 3 -

not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered 1 2 and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the State Treasurer. 3 In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys 4 other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General 5 shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such 6 7 expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees 8 may require.

9 Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and 10 the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and 11 House of Representatives and shall include data for all 12 programs, except for the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, 13 to be submitted prior to September 1, 1992, shall cover the 12-14 month period beginning with the summer term 1991 and shall 15 include:

16 (1) The following counts and distributions for each term 17 during the period:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full time, of faculty members employed part time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours, divided into three course levels--master's, first professional and doctoral.

28 (iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of 29 instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction 30 scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by 19910H1552B2346 - 4 - two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP)
 categories of instructional programs of higher education as
 defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United
 States Department of Education.

5 (iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof. (2) For the summer term and the following academic year in 6 7 total and for each two-digit CIP program category, a classification of faculty members or other professional 8 employees by title, including: professor, associate professor, 9 10 assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, 11 librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type 12 13 of assignment: teaching and nonteaching; and each such set of 14 faculty members or other professional employees to be further 15 subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and 16 the following aggregates for each such subdivided 17 classification:

(i) The number of faculty and other professional employees
and their full-time equivalence in instructional and
noninstructional functions.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

30 (iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours 19910H1552B2346 - 5 -

and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours 1 generated, divided into lower division, upper division, 2 master's, first professional and doctoral course levels. 3 4 (v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student 5 credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, 6 upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course 7 levels. 8

9 (vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and 10 for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary 11 paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal 12 funds and other funds.

13 (3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty 14 member employed full time identified by two-digit CIP program 15 category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the 16 average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom 17 18 contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public 19 20 service.

21 Section 7. In addition to the requirements in section 6 22 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month 23 period beginning with the summer term 1991 shall include for all 24 programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureatedegree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first
professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1989, 1990,
1991 and estimated 1992.

30 Section 8. The University of Pittsburgh shall provide full, 19910H1552B2346 - 6 - complete and accurate information as may be required by the
 Department of Education or the Majority Chairman or the Minority
 Chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the
 Majority Chairman or the Minority Chairman of the Appropriations
 Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 9. The University of Pittsburgh shall report its 6 revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements 7 8 required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for 9 educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education 10 11 Finance Manual, United States Department of Health, Education 12 and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget 13 Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and 14 Universities." 15

Section 10. This act shall take effect July 1, 1991, or immediately, whichever is later.

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
