AN ACT

1 Making an appropriation to the University of the Arts, 2 Philadelphia. 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 5 Section 1. The sum of \$840,000 \$1,120,000 is hereby appropriated to the University of the Arts, Philadelphia, for 6 the fiscal year July 1, 1991, to June 30, 1992, for instruction 7 and student aid. The final payment totaling no less than 25% of 8 this appropriation is contingent on the Secretary of Education 10 certifying to the General Assembly that the University of the 11 Arts has fully cooperated in the Department of Education's 12 efforts to fulfill the requirements of the higher education 13 accountability appropriation to the Department of Education. 14 Section 2. Payments to the University of the Arts on account 15 of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made by the

Section 3. The University of the Arts shall provide full,

Secretary of Education in equal quarterly payments.

- 14 Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1991, or
- 15 immediately, whichever is later.
