A RESOLUTION

1 Directing the Labor Relations Committee to investigate self-2 insurers in worker's compensation. 3 WHEREAS, The Governor's recent proposal for Worker's 4 Compensation includes increasing the number of businesses and employers eligible to be self-insured for worker's compensation; 5 6 and 7 WHEREAS, Companies that self insure can require than an 8 injured worker see a doctor from a company designated list of 9 physicians who represent the companies' interests rather than 10 the injured worker's; and 11 WHEREAS, Those who are seriously injured often face long 12 delays in treatment and payment for their injuries due to the 13 delaying tactics employed by self-insured companies and their 14 attorneys; and 15 WHEREAS, This is an issue which affects employees of at least 700 companies in this Commonwealth; therefore be it 16 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Labor

Relations Committee to initiate an investigation on the
practices of companies that are self-insured and the impact upon
Pennsylvania workers of allowing more companies to become self insured; and be it further

5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the 6 committee to complete its investigation and make its report 7 concerning this issue to the House of Representatives before 8 June 30, 1992.
