## A RESOLUTION

1 Memorializing the Congress of the United States to enact less  
2 stringent enforcement procedures for the removal of certain  
3 outdoor highway advertising signs.

4 WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States enacted very  
5 strict enforcement standards relating to the removal of certain  
6 allegedly illegal highway advertising signs in the Federal  
7 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991; and

8 WHEREAS, The short compliance period of 90 days has placed an  
9 intolerable burden and hardship on the various state  
10 transportation departments and the rural businesses which depend  
11 on such advertising signs; and

12 WHEREAS, Less stringent penalties and longer time frames will  
13 permit the various state transportation departments and  
14 dependent businesses to develop reasonable and legal alternative  
15 sign options; therefore be it

16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the  
17 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Congress of the  
18 United States to enact less stringent enforcement procedures for

1 the removal of certain outdoor highway advertising signs which  
2 permit alternative remedies to the harsh Federal penalties; and  
3 be it further

4       RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to  
5 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each  
6 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
