AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 18 19 20 commissions shall be determined, "requiring a bidder to 21 provide health insurance coverage for its employees. 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 23 hereby enacts as follows: 24 The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known Section 1. as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a 25 26 section to read:

Section 2412.1. Employe Health Program. -- (a) In every case

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- 1 in which the Department of General Services is authorized by
- 2 this act to invite proposals, it shall require the bidder to
- 3 <u>submit evidence that the bidder provides at minimum low-cost</u>
- 4 <u>comprehensive health insurance policies for its employes.</u>
- 5 (b) The low-cost comprehensive health insurance policies
- 6 shall provide the following:
- 7 (1) Twenty-one days of inpatient hospital surgical and
- 8 <u>medical coverage and outpatient hospital care coverage per</u>
- 9 policy year.
- 10 (2) Coverage for at least four office visits per year for
- 11 primary care rendered by a licensed provider.
- 12 (3) Coverage for one mammogram screening per year for
- 13 <u>females fifty years of age or older and coverage for all</u>
- 14 medically necessary mammograms.
- 15 (4) Annual, lifetime or other benefit limits in amounts
- 16 <u>established by the Insurance Department but which initially</u>
- 17 <u>shall be not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000)</u>
- 18 as an annual benefit and two hundred fifty thousand dollars
- 19 (\$250,000) as a lifetime benefit.
- 20 (5) A preexisting condition exclusion, which shall not
- 21 <u>exclude</u>, <u>limit or reduce coverage or benefits in a group health</u>
- 22 insurance agreement or a group health contract beyond six months
- 23 from the effective date of coverage.
- 24 (6) A provision that copayments made by the insured shall
- 25 not exceed twenty per centum (20%) of the charges incurred.
- 26 (7) Such provisions as the Insurance Department may require
- 27 for annual stop loss amounts, conversion and replacement of
- 28 prior carrier's coverage.
- 29 <u>(c) As used in this section:</u>
- 30 <u>"Employe" means an individual who works a minimum of thirty</u>

- 1 (30) hours a week for a bidder in return for compensation.
- 2 <u>"Insured" means any individual or group insured under a low-</u>
- 3 <u>cost comprehensive health insurance policy.</u>
- 4 <u>"Low-cost comprehensive health insurance policy" means a</u>
- 5 policy or subscription contract which an insurer may choose to
- 6 offer to a qualified individual, qualified family or qualified
- 7 group.
- 8 <u>"Outpatient hospital care" means surgery, anesthesia,</u>
- 9 preadmission testing, diagnostic X-rays and medical and
- 10 <u>laboratory services</u>.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
