#### INTRODUCED BY EVANS, MARCH 17, 1993

### REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS, MARCH 17, 1993

#### AN ACT

Amending the act of June 30, 1992 (P.L. , No.8A), entitled "An 1 act to provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 2 3 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 4 Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, for certain 5 6 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 8 ending June 30, 1992; to provide appropriations from the 9 State Lottery Fund, the Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization 10 Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores Fund, the 11 Milk Marketing Fund and the Emergency Medical Services 12 13 Operating Fund to the Executive Department; to provide 14 appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation 15 Account to the Judicial Department; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, 16 17 to June 30, 1993, for the proper operation of the several 18 departments of the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the 19 20 21 Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth and 22 for the establishment of restricted receipt accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, and for the 23 24 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close 25 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992; to provide for the 26 additional appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive 27 Department of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 28 1991, to June 30, 1992, and for the payment of bills incurred 29 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending 30 June 30, 1992, " increasing certain appropriations and adding appropriations to the Executive, Legislative and Judicial 31 Departments of the Commonwealth from the General Fund, the 32 33 State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance

Motor License Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund and 2 the Home Investment Trust Fund. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1.
