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AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 2 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for 4 the fiscal year July 1, 1993, to June 30, 1994, for certain 5 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 6 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 7 ending June 30, 1993; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization 9 Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores Fund, the 10 11 Milk Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust Fund and the 12 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the Executive 13 Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial 14 Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial 15 Department; to provide appropriations from the Motor License 16 Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1993, to June 30, 1994, for 17 the proper operation of the several departments of the 18 Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to 19 spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the 20 appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive and Judicial 21 Departments of the Commonwealth and for the establishment of 22 restricted receipt accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 1993, 23 to June 30, 1994, and for the payment of bills remaining 24 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1993; 25 and to provide for the additional appropriation of State and 26 Federal funds to the Executive, Legislative and Judicial 27 Departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 28 1992, to June 30, 1993, and for the payment of bills incurred 29 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending 30 June 30, 1992.

- 8 expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the
- 9 proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for
- 10 the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning
- 11 July 1, 1993, and for the payment of bills incurred and
- 12 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30,
- 13 1993.
- 14 (f) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund. -- The

- 16 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the

- 19 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of

- 1 Section 107. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The
- 2 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
- 3 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
- 4 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies
- 5 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the
- 6 purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are
- 7 provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1993.
- 8 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small
- 9 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
- 10 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
- 11 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
- 12 low and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet
- 13 community development needs.
- 14 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services
- 15 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
- 16 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on
- 17 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the
- 18 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In
- 19 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old
- 20 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements
- 21 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to
- 22 assure proper consideration of each recipient.
- 23 (d) Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.--
- 24 The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG)
- 25 will be used for the administration and provision of education
- 26 programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus
- 27 Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981 and the 1988-1989
- 28 reauthorization of ECIA Chapter 2 funds.
- 29 (e) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant. -- The
- 30 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is

- 1 for the provision of preventive health and other health services
- 2 related to emergency medical comprehensive public health,
- 3 hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction,
- 4 home health, rape crisis and rodent control.
- 5 (f) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The
- 6 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
- 7 assure mothers and children access to quality maternal and child
- 8 health services, to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of
- 9 preventable disease and handicapping conditions among children,
- 10 to provide rehabilitative services for blind and disabled
- 11 individuals under the age of 16 receiving Supplemental Security
- 12 Income benefits and to provide medical services for children
- 13 with crippling conditions.
- 14 (g) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-
- 15 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help
- 16 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income
- 17 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for
- 18 low-income dwellings.
- 19 (h) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block
- 20 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
- 21 persons.
- 22 (i) Child Care and Development Block Grant.--The Child Care
- 23 and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) is for the provision of
- 24 direct child care or to increase the availability of child care
- 25 for low-income families.
- 26 (j) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health
- 27 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of
- 28 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with
- 29 serious emotional disturbance.
- 30 (k) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block

- 5 Section 1488. Deduction of expended appropriations under
- 6 prior law.--Any money that has been appropriated and expended
- 7 under the act of June 30, 1992 (P.L. , No.8A), known as the
- 8 General Appropriation Act of 1992, shall be deducted from the
- 9 corresponding appropriation in this part.
- 10 Section 1489. Revision of lapsing periods. -- Notwithstanding
- 11 the provisions of section 1506 of the act of June 30, 1992 (P.L.
- 12 , No.8A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1992, to
- 13 the contrary:
- 14 (1) The appropriation in Part II of that act to the

2 SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR FEDERAL FUNDS

- 3 Section 1501. General Fund repository for Federal funds.--
- 4 All moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions
- 5 or supplements to the departments or agencies of the
- 6 Commonwealth or the programs herein provided shall be paid into
- 7 the General Fund.
- 8 Section 1502. Limitation on encumbering or spending Federal
- 9 funds.--Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the
- 10 extent that such funds are estimated as being available during
- 11 the fiscal year of the Commonwealth.
- 12 Section 1503. Appropriation of prior unspent Federal
- 13 funds. -- Any Federal money which has been previously appropriated
- 14 by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated by the
- 15 Federal Government but remains unspent from prior fiscal years
- 16 and will not be renewed for fiscal year 1993-1994 is hereby
- 17 appropriated.
- 18 Section 1504. Subgrants between Federal fund
- 19 appropriations. -- With the exception of Federal money received
- 20 under JTPA and SSBG, subgrants may be made between
- 21 appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly.
- 22 The Secretary of the Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to
- 23 the Chairmen of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees
- 24 quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made
- 25 from a restricted receipt account without a specific
- 26 appropriation by the General Assembly.
- 27 Section 1505. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.--(a)

- 26 highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services, shall
- 27 report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to
- 28 anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal
- 29 year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.
- 30 (b) As used in this section, the term "minority business"

- 1 means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of

- 29 Section 1606. Lapsing of unused funds.--(a) Except as
- 30 otherwise provided by law or in this section, that part of all

- 2 and XII unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30,

- 22 1992. -- Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1307 of the act
- 23 of August 4, 1991 (P.L.484, No.7A), known as the General
- 24 Appropriation Act of 1991, the appropriation in Part II of that
- 25 act to the Department of Public Welfare for women's service
- 26 programs shall be a three-year continuing appropriation.
- 27 Section 1608. Allocation of certain appropriations. -- (a) Up
- 28 to 1% of the appropriations listed in this section may be
- 29 allocated to the Department of Education to establish, in
- 30 conjunction with the Department of Health and the Department of

- 1 Public Welfare, community-based family centers. The total which

- 23 Program upon approval by the Governor.
- 24 Section 1610. Proceeds of sale of Nursing Home Loans.--
- 25 Moneys received from the sale, pledge or other alienation of
- 26 Nursing Home Loan Agency receivables shall be deposited as
- 27 follows: the first \$10,000,000 shall be deposited with the
- 28 Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency for establishment of a

- 14 transfer, certify to the Governor and the majority and minority
