AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 11, 1917 (P.L.818, No.317), entitled "An act relating to dogs, and the protection of livestock and 2 3 poultry from damage by dogs; providing for the licensing of dogs; regulating the keeping of dogs, and authorizing their 5 destruction in certain cases; providing for the protection of 6 licensed dogs, and for dogs temporarily imported for trial, 7 show, and breeding purposes; prescribing certain privileges 8 for hunting dogs, and dogs owned or used by the Board of Game Commissioners; providing for the assessment of damages done by dogs, and payment thereof by the proper county to the 9 10 11 owners of livestock and poultry, and of damages to licensed 12 dogs; imposing powers and duties on certain State, county, 13 city, borough, town, and township officers and employes, and on city councils of cities of the first and second class; and 14 15 providing penalties, providing for reports relating to 16 certain dogs.
- 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 18 hereby enacts as follows:
- 19 Section 1. The act of July 11, 1917 (P.L.818, No.317), known
- 20 as the Dog Law of One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventeen, is
- 21 amended by adding a section to read:
- 22 <u>Section 15.1. A police officer or a veterinarian aware of a</u>
- 23 dog that has bitten any person shall produce a written report
- 24 concerning the circumstances of the incident and file it with

- the police in the municipality where the owner of the dog 1
- 2 <u>resides</u>, if the name and municipality of residence of the owner
- 3 <u>is known. The report shall be available for public inspection</u>
- 4 for a dog owner against whom two or more reports of separate
- incidents of dog bites have been reported. 5
- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 6
