AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, further providing for the certification of
- 3 employees and equipment to perform vehicle weight
- 4 inspections.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 4981(a) and (e) of Title 75 of the
- 8 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section
- 9 is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 10 § 4981. Weighing and measurement of vehicles.
- 11 (a) Authority of police officers and qualified department
- 12 employees.--Any police officer or qualified department employee
- 13 is authorized to require the driver of any vehicle or
- 14 combination to stop and submit the vehicle or combination to be
- 15 measured and weighed. Weighing may be done by using either
- 16 portable or stationary scales, provided that when portable
- 17 scales more than one inch in height are used, sufficient ramp
- 18 blocks shall be made available to allow the vehicle or

- 1 combination to mount the scales safely. The weighing shall be
- 2 conducted by qualified personnel who have been trained in the
- 3 use of weighing equipment in a training program approved by [the
- 4 Department of Agriculture] an agency of this Commonwealth. The
- 5 personnel performing the weighing on all highways and
- 6 interstates in this Commonwealth shall inform the drivers of the
- 7 vehicle of the right to readjust or rearrange the load under
- 8 section 4982(c) (relating to reducing or readjusting loads of
- 9 vehicles). The driver or owner, if present, of any vehicle or
- 10 combination may, at the time of weighing, witness in an orderly
- 11 fashion the weighing procedure. If the driver wishes to witness
- 12 the procedure from outside the cab of the vehicle, he shall be
- 13 required to turn off the engine, put the transmission in gear
- 14 and set the emergency brake before leaving the cab. A police
- 15 officer or qualified department employee may require that a
- 16 vehicle or combination be driven to the nearest available
- 17 portable or stationary scales if the scales are within two
- 18 miles.

- 20 (e) [Calibration] <u>Certification and accuracy</u> of portable
- 21 scales.--Portable scales shall be [calibrated] checked every 30
- 22 days for the purpose of certification [and] of accuracy by the
- 23 Department of [Agriculture.] <u>General Services. A certificate</u>
- 24 <u>from the Department of General Services showing that portable</u>
- 25 scales were checked and found to be accurate shall be competent
- 26 and prima facie evidence of those facts in every proceeding in
- 27 which a violation of this chapter is charged. This certificate
- 28 and the weight of a vehicle or combination as determined by
- 29 portable scales so certified shall not be contradicted except by
- 30 <u>clear and convincing evidence</u>.

- 1 (f) Certification of qualified personnel.--The competency of
- 2 <u>a witness to testify concerning the weighing of a vehicle may be</u>
- 3 <u>established by a certificate from an agency of this Commonwealth</u>
- 4 showing that the person was trained in the use of weighing
- 5 <u>equipment in a training program approved by a Commonwealth</u>
- 6 agency. This certification shall be admissible as competent and
- 7 prima facie evidence that the person is qualified and trained in
- 8 the use of weighing equipment.
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
