1 2 3 4	Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, authorizing courts to enter orders requiring the presence of parents, guardians or custodians at proceedings for juveniles.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding sections to read:
9	<u>§ 6311. Participation order.</u>
10	(a) General ruleIn any proceedings under this chapter, a
11	court may enter an order specifically requiring a parent or
12	guardian to participate in the rehabilitation process of a
13	juvenile.
14	(b) Presence at proceedingsThe court may, when the court
15	determines that it is in the best interests of the child, issue
16	an order applicable to a parent or guardian of a child and the
17	person with whom the child resides, if other than the child's
18	parent or guardian. The order shall require the parent or

1	guardian and the person with whom the child resides, if other	
2	than the parent or guardian, to be present at any juvenile	
3	proceeding concerning the child.	
4	(c) ContemptA person failing to comply with an order of	
5	protection without good cause may be found in contempt of court.	
б	(d) Detention	
7	(1) The court shall issue a bench warrant for any parent	
8	or guardian or person with whom the child resides, if other	
9	than the parent or guardian, who, without good cause, fails	
10	to appear at any proceeding.	
11	(2) For purposes of this subsection, good cause for	
12	failing to appear shall include, but shall not be limited to,	
13	a situation where a parent or guardian:	
14	(i) does not have physical custody of the child and	
15	resides outside of this Commonwealth;	
16	(ii) has physical custody of the child, but resides	
17	outside of this Commonwealth and appearing in court will	
18	result in undue hardship to such parent or guardian; or	
19	(iii) resides in this Commonwealth, but is outside	
20	of the State at the time of the juvenile proceeding for	
21	reasons other than avoiding appearance before the court	
22	and appearing in court will result in undue hardship to	
23	<u>such parent or guardian.</u>	
24	(e) IntentThe General Assembly hereby declares that every	
25	parent or guardian whose child is the subject of a juvenile	
26	proceeding under this chapter should attend any such proceeding	
27	<u>as often as is practicable.</u>	
28	(f) LimitationNothing in this section shall be construed	
29	to create a right for any juvenile to have his parent or	
30	guardian present at any proceeding at which such juvenile is	
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1 present.

§ 6312. Joinder in proceedings. 2

3 (a) General rule.--The court may, when the court determines 4 that it is in the best interests of the child, join the child's 5 parent or quardian and the person with whom the child resides, if other than the child's parent or quardian, as a respondent to 6 the action and may issue a summons requiring the parent or 7 8 quardian and the person with whom the child resides, if other 9 than the child's parent or quardian, to appear with the child at 10 all proceedings under this chapter involving the child. If the 11 parent or quardian of any child cannot be found, the court, in its discretion, may proceed with the case without the presence 12 13 of such parent or quardian. This section shall not apply to any person whose parental rights have been terminated pursuant to 14 15 the provisions of Title 23 (relating to domestic relations) or 16 the parent of an emancipated minor. 17 (b) Requirement.--The summons shall require the person or 18 persons having the physical custody of the juvenile, if other than a parent or quardian, to appear and to bring the juvenile 19 20 before the court at a time and place stated. § 6313. Penalties. 21 22 (a) General rule.--Except as provided by subsection (b), any 23 person summoned or required to appear as provided in section 6312 (relating to joinder in proceedings) who has acknowledged 24 25 service and fails to appear without reasonable cause may be 26 proceeded against for contempt of court. 27 (b) Detention.--28 (1) When a parent or other person who signed a written promise to appear and bring the juvenile to court or who has 29 30 waived or acknowledged service fails to appear with the 19930H2177B2711 - 3 -

1	juvenile on the date set by the court, a bench warrant may be
2	issued for the parent or other person, the juvenile, or both.
3	(2) Whenever a parent or guardian or person with whom
4	the juvenile resides, if other than the parent or guardian,
5	who has received a summons to appear fails, without good
6	cause, to appear on any other date set by the court, a bench
7	warrant shall be issued for the parent, guardian or person
8	with whom the juvenile resides, and the parent, guardian or
9	person with whom the juvenile resides shall be subject to
10	contempt.
11	(3) For purposes of this subsection, good cause for
12	failing to appear shall include, but not be limited to, a
13	situation where a parent or guardian:
14	(i) does not have physical custody of the child and
15	resides outside of this Commonwealth;
16	(ii) has physical custody of the child, but resides
17	outside of this Commonwealth and appearing in court will
18	result in undue hardship to such parent or guardian; or
19	(iii) resides in this Commonwealth, but is outside
20	of the State at the time of the juvenile proceeding for
21	reasons other than avoiding appearance before the court
22	and appearing in court will result in undue hardship to
23	<u>such parent or guardian.</u>
24	(4) The nonappearance of such parent, guardian or person
25	with whom the child resides shall not be the basis for a
26	continuance.
27	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
