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## AN ACT

1 To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the  
2 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
3 Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for  
4 the fiscal year July 1, 1994, to June 30, 1995, for certain  
5 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills  
6 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year  
7 ending June 30, 1994; to provide appropriations from the  
8 State Lottery Fund, the Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization  
9 Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores  
10 Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust  
11 Fund, the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund, the Ben  
12 Franklin/IRC Partnership Fund and the Treasury Payment Fund  
13 to the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from  
14 the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the  
15 Judicial Department; to provide appropriations from the Motor  
16 License Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1994, to June 30,  
17 1995, for the proper operation of the several departments of  
18 the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized  
19 to spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the  
20 appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive and Judicial  
21 Departments of the Commonwealth and for the establishment of  
22 restricted receipt accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 1994,  
23 to June 30, 1995, and for the payment of bills remaining  
24 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994;  
25 and to provide for the additional appropriation of State and  
26 Federal funds to the Executive and Legislative Departments of  
27 the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 1993, to June  
28 30, 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining  
29 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1993.

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10       The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
11 hereby enacts as follows:

12                                   PART I

13   GENERAL PROVISIONS

14       Section 101. Short title.--This act shall be known and may  
15 be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 1994.

16       Section 102. Definitions.--The following words and phrases  
17 when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in  
18 this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

19       "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau  
20 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant  
21 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,  
22 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,  
23 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,  
24 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and  
25 other assistants in any department, board or commission.

26       "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding  
27 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,  
28 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and  
29 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and  
30 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and



1 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,  
2 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,  
3 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and  
4 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on  
5 workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of  
6 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment  
7 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on  
8 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee  
9 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth  
10 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation  
11 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or  
12 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental  
13 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of  
14 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of  
15 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned  
16 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred  
17 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall  
18 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State  
19 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside  
20 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution  
21 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State  
22 medical assistance program.

10 Section 104. State appropriations.--(a) General Fund.--The  
11 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
12 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
13 General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the  
14 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
15 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other  
16 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or  
17 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the  
18 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
19 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public  
20 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and  
21 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by  
22 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the  
23 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
24 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
25 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
26 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

27 (b) State Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in  
28 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
29 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the  
30 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department

1 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other  
2 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers  
3 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for  
4 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of  
5 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as  
6 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct  
7 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
8 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
9 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
10 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

11 (c) Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund.--The  
12 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
13 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
14 Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund to the several  
15 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the  
16 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services  
17 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and  
18 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by  
19 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties,  
20 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set  
21 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1994, and for the  
22 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of  
23 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

24 (d) Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account.--The  
25 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
26 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
27 restricted receipt account established within the General Fund,  
28 known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to  
29 the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of  
30 fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or

1 rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other  
2 expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the  
3 proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for  
4 the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning  
5 July 1, 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred and  
6 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30,  
7 1994.

8 (e) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The  
9 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
10 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
11 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several  
12 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the  
13 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services  
14 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and  
15 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by  
16 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties,  
17 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set  
18 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1994, and for the  
19 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of  
20 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

21 (f) The State Stores Fund.--The following sums set forth in  
22 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
23 specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the  
24 hereinafter named agency of the Executive Department of the  
25 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other  
26 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers  
27 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for  
28 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of  
29 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as  
30 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct

1 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
2 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
3 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
4 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

5 (g) Motor License Fund.--The following sums, or as much  
6 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the  
7 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the  
8 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other  
9 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or  
10 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for  
11 contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper  
12 conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes  
13 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
14 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
15 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

16 (h) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account.--The following  
17 sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
18 appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the  
19 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the  
20 Commonwealth for the purposes set forth herein for the fiscal  
21 year beginning July 1, 1994, and for the payment of bills  
22 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year  
23 ending June 30, 1994.

24 (i) Hazardous Material Response Fund.--The following sums  
25 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary,  
26 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Hazardous Material  
27 Response Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the  
28 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees  
29 for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of  
30 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as

1 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct  
2 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
3 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
4 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
5 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

6 (j) Milk Marketing Fund.--The following sums set forth in  
7 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
8 specifically appropriated from the Milk Marketing Fund to the  
9 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department  
10 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other  
11 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers  
12 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for  
13 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of  
14 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as  
15 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct  
16 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
17 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
18 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
19 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

20 (k) Home Investment Trust Fund.--The following sums set  
21 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are  
22 hereby specifically appropriated from the Home Investment Trust  
23 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive  
24 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries,  
25 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly  
26 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the  
27 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
28 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of  
29 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary  
30 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities

1 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year  
2 beginning July 1, 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred  
3 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June  
4 30, 1994.

5 (l) Ben Franklin/IRC Partnership Fund.--The following sums  
6 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary,  
7 are hereby appropriated from the Ben Franklin/IRC Partnership  
8 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive  
9 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries,  
10 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly  
11 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the  
12 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
13 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of  
14 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary  
15 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities  
16 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year  
17 beginning July 1, 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred  
18 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June  
19 30, 1994.

20 (m) Tuition Payment Fund.--The following sums set forth in  
21 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
22 appropriated from the Tuition Payment Fund to the hereinafter  
23 named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth  
24 for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and  
25 travel expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of  
26 the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual  
27 services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and  
28 services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided  
29 by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the  
30 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes



1 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
2 1994, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
3 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

4 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.--The  
5 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this  
6 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
7 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to  
8 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and  
9 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the  
10 expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated  
11 herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1994, and for the  
12 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of  
13 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994. Unless otherwise stated,  
14 the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal  
15 year.

16 Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations.--  
17 The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as  
18 may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Job Training  
19 Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several hereinafter named  
20 agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the  
21 payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the  
22 program stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
23 1994.

24 Section 107. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The  
25 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
26 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
27 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies  
28 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the  
29 purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are  
30 provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1994.

1 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small  
2 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small  
3 cities and communities that have a high concentration of  
4 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their  
5 low and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet  
6 community development needs.

7 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services  
8 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and  
9 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on  
10 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the  
11 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In  
12 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old  
13 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements  
14 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to  
15 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

16 (d) Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.--  
17 The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG)  
18 will be used for the administration and provision of education  
19 programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus  
20 Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981 and the 1988-1989  
21 reauthorization of ECIA Chapter 2 funds.

22 (e) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The  
23 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is  
24 for the provision of preventive health and other health services  
25 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,  
26 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health  
27 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and rodent  
28 control.

29 (f) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The  
30 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to

1 assure mothers and children access to quality maternal and child  
2 health services, to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of  
3 preventable disease and disabling conditions among children, to  
4 provide rehabilitative services for blind and disabled  
5 individuals under the age of 16 receiving Supplemental Security  
6 Income benefits and to provide medical services for children  
7 with disabling conditions.

8 (g) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-  
9 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help  
10 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income  
11 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for  
12 low-income dwellings.

13 (h) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block  
14 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible  
15 persons.

16 (i) Child Care and Development Block Grant.--The Child Care  
17 and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) is for the provision of  
18 direct child care or to increase the availability of child care  
19 for low-income families.

20 (j) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health  
21 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of  
22 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with  
23 serious emotional disturbance.

24 (k) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block  
25 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs  
26 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

27 Section 108. Revenue and receipts.--(a) General Fund.--The  
28 General Assembly hereby estimates that \$15,788,781,000 in State  
29 funds and \$7,596,302,000 in Federal funds will be available from  
30 the General Fund. Of the amount of State funds, \$26,843,000 is

1 assumed for executive authorizations.

2 (b) State Lottery Fund.--The General Assembly hereby  
3 estimates that \$860,163,000 in State funds, and \$70,227,000 in  
4 Federal funds will be available from the State Lottery Fund. Of  
5 the amount of State funds, \$454,369,000 is assumed for executive  
6 authorizations.

7 (c) Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund.--The General  
8 Assembly hereby estimates that \$69,547,000 in State funds and no  
9 Federal funds will be available from the Pennsylvania Economic  
10 Revitalization Fund. Of the amount of State funds, \$5,000 is  
11 assumed for executive authorizations.

12 (d) Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund.--The General  
13 Assembly hereby estimates that \$289,000,000 in State funds and  
14 no Federal funds will be available from the Energy Conservation  
15 and Assistance Fund. Of the amount of State funds, none is  
16 assumed for executive authorizations.

17 (e) Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account.--The  
18 General Assembly hereby estimates that \$13,000,000 in State  
19 funds will be available to spend from the Judicial Computer  
20 System Augmentation Account.

21 (f) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The General  
22 Assembly hereby estimates that \$24,118,000 in State funds, and  
23 \$800,000 in Federal funds will be available from the Emergency  
24 Medical Services Operating Fund. Of the amount of State funds,  
25 none is assumed for executive authorizations.

26 (g) The State Stores Fund.--The General Assembly hereby  
27 estimates that \$989,922,000 in State funds, and \$354,000 in  
28 Federal funds will be available from The State Stores Fund. Of  
29 the amount of State funds, \$749,723,000 is assumed for executive  
30 authorizations.

1 (h) Motor License Fund.--The General Assembly hereby  
2 estimates that \$1,597,440,000 in State funds, and \$814,421,000  
3 in Federal funds will be available from the Motor License Fund.  
4 Of the amount of State funds, \$67,382,000 is assumed for  
5 executive authorizations.

6 (i) Aviation Restricted Account.--The General Assembly  
7 hereby estimates that \$28,412,000 in State funds will be  
8 available to spend from the Aviation Restricted Account. Of the  
9 amount of State funds, none is assumed for executive  
10 authorizations.

11 (j) Hazardous Material Response Fund.--The General Assembly  
12 hereby estimates that \$1,373,000 in State funds, and no Federal  
13 funds will be available from the Hazardous Material Response  
14 Fund. Of the amount of State funds, none is assumed for  
15 executive authorizations.

16 (k) Milk Marketing Fund.--The General Assembly hereby  
17 estimates that \$2,048,000 in State funds, and no Federal funds  
18 will be available from the Milk Marketing Fund. Of the amount of  
19 State funds, \$10,000 is assumed for executive authorizations.

20 (l) Home Investment Trust Fund.--The General Assembly hereby  
21 estimates that \$7,500,000 in Federal funds will be available  
22 from the Home Investment Trust Fund.

23 (m) Ben Franklin/IRC Partnership Fund.--The General Assembly  
24 hereby estimates that \$33,540,000 in State funds, and \$880,000  
25 in Federal funds will be available from the Ben Franklin/IRC  
26 Partnership Fund. Of these amounts, none is assumed for  
27 executive authorizations.

Section 201. Governor.--The

following amounts are appropriated to

the Governor:

Federal State

For the Office of the Governor,  
including the maintenance of the  
Governor's Home, the expense of  
entertainment of official guests and  
members of the General Assembly and  
the Judiciary, participation in the  
Governor's Conference, the expenses of  
the Executive Board and the payment of  
traveling expenses of persons other  
than employees of the Commonwealth  
appointed by the Governor to represent  
or otherwise serve the Commonwealth.

13 PART XVI

14 SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR FEDERAL FUNDS

15 Section 1601. General Fund repository for Federal funds.--  
16 All moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions  
17 or supplements to the departments or agencies of the  
18 Commonwealth or the programs herein provided shall be paid into  
19 the General Fund.

20 Section 1602. Limitation on encumbering or spending Federal  
21 funds.--Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the  
22 extent that such funds are estimated as being available during  
23 the fiscal year of the Commonwealth.

24 Section 1603. Appropriation of prior unspent Federal  
25 funds.--Any Federal money which has been previously appropriated  
26 by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated by the  
27 Federal Government but remains unspent from prior fiscal years  
28 and will not be renewed for fiscal year 1994-1995 is hereby  
29 appropriated.

30 Section 1604. Subgrants between Federal fund

1 appropriations.--With the exception of Federal money received  
2 under JTPA and SSBG, subgrants may be made between  
3 appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly.  
4 The Secretary of the Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to  
5 the Chairmen of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees  
6 quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made  
7 from a restricted receipt account without a specific  
8 appropriation by the General Assembly.

9 Section 1605. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.--(a)  
10 Federal funds available for costs and damages resulting from  
11 natural disasters or civil disobedience may be added to an  
12 appropriation contained in this act or to funds appropriated or  
13 may be used for the purposes prescribed by the Federal  
14 Government.

15 (b) In addition to the moneys appropriated by this act, all  
16 moneys received from the Federal Government for the purpose of  
17 disaster assistance or relief shall be paid into the General

21 (c) In the event of any emergency situation in which the  
22 General Assembly cannot act in sufficient time, the Governor is

29 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

30 Section 1701. Prior laws unaffected.--Except as provided in

1 section 253, this act is not intended to be inconsistent with or  
2 to repeal any provision of any act enacted at this or any prior  
3 session of the General Assembly regulating the purchase of  
4 supplies, the ordering of printing and binding, the purchase,  
5 maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making  
6 payments from the State Treasury for any purpose or the  
7 functioning of any administrative department, board or  
8 commission.

9 Section 1702. Compliance with other law before funds  
10 available.--No appropriation made by this act to any department,  
11 board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be  
12 available unless and until the department, board, commission or  
13 agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of  
14 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative  
15 Code of 1929.

16 Section 1703. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or  
17 committing funds.--Funds for the purchase of supplies, materials  
18 and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered  
19 until contracts covering the purchase have been entered into  
20 with the vendors.

21 Section 1704. Minority business set-asides.--(a) Each  
22 department or other instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed  
23 in Subpart A of Part II, authorized to contract for buildings,  
24 highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services, shall  
25 report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to  
26 anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal  
27 year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.

28 (b) As used in this section, the term "minority business"  
29 means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of  
30 July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the Pennsylvania

1 Minority Business Development Authority Act.

2 Section 1705. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous  
3 sources.--(a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this  
4 act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies  
5 furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an  
6 institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale  
7 of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other  
8 materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General  
9 Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the  
10 several respective institutions for the operation and  
11 maintenance of the institutions.

12 (b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all  
13 moneys received from any other source, except the Federal  
14 Government, as contributions for the programs provided herein or  
15 as payment for services or materials furnished by one  
16 institution to another, except those collections designated as  
17 revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby  
18 appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the  
19 respective appropriations.

20 (c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by  
21 this act, all moneys received by a department or agency of the  
22 Commonwealth from any other sources, except the Federal  
23 Government, as contributions or supplements to the department or  
24 agency for a program or administration of an act included in  
25 this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the  
26 appropriation for that program or administration of the act.

27 Section 1706. Lapsing of unused funds.--(a) Except as  
28 otherwise provided by law or in this section, that part of all  
29 appropriations in Parts II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X,  
30 XI, XII and XIII unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of

1 June 30, 1995, shall automatically lapse as of that date.

2 (b) The appropriations in Part II to the Department of  
3 Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance and  
4 enterprise development shall be two-year continuing  
5 appropriations.

6 (c) The appropriations in Part II to the Department of  
7 Education for JTPA matching funds and Woodland Hill School  
8 District desegregation shall be two-year continuing  
9 appropriations.

10 (d) The appropriations in Part II to the Department of  
11 Environmental Resources for the Chesapeake Bay Pollution  
12 Abatement Program and the black fly control program shall be  
13 two-year continuing appropriations.

14 (e) The appropriation in Part II to the Department of  
15 General Services for printing of the Pennsylvania Manual shall  
16 be a two-year continuing appropriation.

17 (f) The appropriation in Part II to the Pennsylvania Higher  
18 Education Assistance Agency for urban and rural loan forgiveness  
19 shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

20 (g) The appropriations in Part II to the Legislative  
21 Department shall be continuing appropriations.

22 (h) The appropriation in Part III to the Department of Aging  
23 for senior centers shall be a three-year continuing  
24 appropriation.

25 (i) The appropriation in Part IV to the Department of  
26 Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment economic set-  
27 aside shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

28 (j) The appropriation in Part IV to the Department of Labor  
29 and Industry for the Pennsylvania Conservation Corps shall be a  
30 two-year continuing appropriation.



1 (k) The appropriation in Part IV to the Department of  
2 Commerce for business infrastructure development shall be a two-  
3 year continuing appropriation.

4 (l) The appropriations in section 821 of Part VIII for  
5 airport development, runway rehabilitation, business airport  
6 grants and real estate tax rebate payments shall be two-year  
7 continuing appropriations.

8 (m) The appropriation in Part XII to the Industrial Resource  
9 Centers shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

10 Section 1707. Revision of lapse period for fiscal year 1992-  
11 1993.--Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1506 of the act  
12 of June 30, 1992 (P.L.1859, No.8A), known as the General  
13 Appropriation Act of 1992, the appropriation in Part II of that  
14 act to the Department of Military Affairs for the Veterans'  
15 Memorial Commission shall be a three-year continuing  
16 appropriation.

17 Section 1708. Allocation of certain appropriations.--(a) Up  
18 to 1% of the appropriations listed in this section may be  
19 allocated to the Department of Education to establish, in  
20 conjunction with the Department of Health, Department of Labor  
21 and Industry and the Department of Public Welfare, community-  
22 based family centers. The total which may be allocated is  
23 \$1,558,000. These funds will be used to match private, Federal  
24 or local funds that may become available to support the  
25 development of family centers which provide early childhood  
26 development and parenting education programs, including  
27 parenting projects, and establish information and referral  
28 networks with local health care and social service agencies, and

20 Section 1709. Use of residual waste permit fees by  
21 Department of Environmental Resources.--All moneys collected for  
22 residual waste permit fees by the Department of Environmental  
23 Resources during the 1994-1995 fiscal year shall be retained by  
24 the department for its use in operating the Residual Waste  
25 Program upon approval by the Governor.

26 Section 1710. Transfer from Pennsylvania Capital Loan  
27 Fund.--The sum of \$15,000,000 is transferred from the  
28 Pennsylvania Capital Loan Fund into the Pennsylvania Economic  
29 Revitalization Fund.

30 Section 1711. Transfer from Agriculture Farm Operations

1 Account.--The sum of \$600,000 is transferred from the  
2 Agriculture Farm Operations Account to the General Fund.

5 Section 1801. Effective date.--This act shall take effect as
