A RESOLUTION

- Memorializing each member of Congress from Pennsylvania to support H.R.3744 and S.R.1803 to give Congress greater oversight over United States Armed Forces participation in United Nations peacekeeping operations.
- 5 WHEREAS, The President has affirmed that his foreign policy
- 6 will bear little change from that of his predecessor regarding
- 7 the deployment of the United States Armed Forces in support of
- 8 United Nations peacekeeping missions; and
- 9 WHEREAS, With the end of the Cold War, there is a growing
- 10 tendency in United States foreign policy toward participation in
- 11 multilateral peacekeeping actions with situations where units of
- 12 the United States Armed Forces are placed under United Nations
- 13 commanders; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The constitutional role of our military is to
- 15 protect the life, liberty and property of United States citizens
- 16 and to defend our nation against insurrection or foreign
- 17 invasion; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Our servicemen's lives should only be put at risk in

- 1 defense of our nation's clearly defined vital interests and not
- 2 in support of policy decisions made by United Nations officials;
- 3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, The War Powers Act and other current Federal
- 5 statutes do not specifically limit the President's ability to
- 6 make commitments of the United States Armed Forces to United
- 7 Nations peacekeeping missions which may not be in the national
- 8 interest or possess any significant popular support; therefore
- 9 be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 11 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania believe that:
- 12 (1) The United States must maintain and ensure the
- primacy of its national security interests with respect to
- 14 participation in United Nations peacekeeping activities.
- 15 (2) Although the President must maintain his traditional
- 16 constitutional powers in relation to the deployment of the
- 17 United States Armed Forces in defense of our Nation's vital
- 18 national interests, Congress must have greater oversight and
- 19 voice in the commitment of our servicemen to constitutionally
- 20 "gray area" peacekeeping missions decided upon by the United
- 21 Nations such as Somalia and Bosnia.
- 22 (3) Greater Congressional oversight of these types of
- 23 multilateral peacekeeping missions will aid in preventing the
- deployment of our sons and daughters to far flung parts of
- 25 the world in pursuit of unclear United Nations policies and
- 26 possibly situations with no popular support;
- 27 and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 29 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania believe that H.R.3744 and S.R.1803
- 30 are identical bills that propose sound measures for

- 1 Congressional oversight of United States troop commitments to
- 2 United Nations peacekeeping operations whose major provisions
- 3 include:
- 4 (1) Any special agreement or agreements negotiated by
- 5 the President with the Security Council providing for the
- 6 deployment of the United States Armed Forces at the request
- of the Security Council in peacekeeping operations conducted
- 8 under Title 43 of the United Nations Charter shall be subject
- 9 to approval of Congress by act or joint resolution.
- 10 (2) The President may not subordinate to the command or
- operational control of any foreign nationals any element of
- the United States Armed Forces participating in United
- Nations peacekeeping activity unless Congress enacts an act
- or a joint resolution specifically authorizing such
- 15 subordination or the President satisfies notification and
- formal reporting requirements detailing sound reasons for
- 17 such deployment to Congressional committees designated in the
- 18 bill; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 20 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Pennsylvania
- 21 Congressional Delegation to support H.R.3744 and S.R.1803 which
- 22 propose greater Congressional oversight of commitments of the
- 23 United States Armed Forces to United Nations peacekeeping
- 24 operations; and be it further
- 25 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 26 each member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
