## A RESOLUTION

Memorializing Pennsylvania school districts and superintendents to institute plans for emergency weather management; and designating the first week of the school term as "Emergency Weather Management Week."

WHEREAS, The safety of school children is of the utmost concern to everyone in this Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Education and the Pennsylvania
Emergency Management Agency have set guidelines for dealing with emergency weather situations such as tornadoes, hurricanes, severe thunderstorms, hailstorms, floods, earthslides and landslides; and

WHEREAS, Not all of this Commonwealth's 501 school districts have instituted these safety guidelines; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly has the utmost concern with regard to compliance to these guidelines; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That every school building in this Commonwealth maintain an emergency weather radio; and be it further

RESOLVED, That every school district, in its emergency management plan, provide for the preparedness of its students and teachers to handle any emergency that may occur from severe weather situations such as tornadoes, hurricanes, severe thunderstorms, hailstorms, floods, earthslides and landslides; and be it further

RESOLVED, That every school district hold two tornado drills annually; and be it further RESOLVED, That the first week of the school term be designated as "Emergency Weather Management Week."
