A RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing Pennsylvania school districts and superintendents
- 2 to institute plans for emergency weather management; and
- 3 designating the first week of the school term as "Emergency
- 4 Weather Management Week."
- 5 WHEREAS, The safety of school children is of the utmost
- 6 concern to everyone in this Commonwealth; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Department of Education and the Pennsylvania
- 8 Emergency Management Agency have set guidelines for dealing with
- 9 emergency weather situations such as tornadoes, hurricanes,
- 10 severe thunderstorms, hailstorms, floods, earthslides and
- 11 landslides; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Not all of this Commonwealth's 501 school districts
- 13 have instituted these safety guidelines; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The General Assembly has the utmost concern with
- 15 regard to compliance to these guidelines; therefore be it
- 16 RESOLVED, That every school building in this Commonwealth
- 17 maintain an emergency weather radio; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That every school district, in its emergency
- 2 management plan, provide for the preparedness of its students
- 3 and teachers to handle any emergency that may occur from severe
- 4 weather situations such as tornadoes, hurricanes, severe
- 5 thunderstorms, hailstorms, floods, earthslides and landslides;
- 6 and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That every school district hold two tornado drills
- 8 annually; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the first week of the school term be
- 10 designated as "Emergency Weather Management Week."
