4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section 5313 of Title 23 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 5313. When child has resided with grandparents.
9	(a) Partial custody and visitationIf an unmarried child
10	has resided with his grandparents or great-grandparents for a
11	period of 12 months or more and is subsequently removed from the
12	home by his parents, the grandparents or great-grandparents may
13	petition the court for an order granting them reasonable partial
14	custody or visitation rights, or both, to the child. The court
15	shall grant the petition if it finds that visitation rights
16	would be in the best interest of the child and would not
17	interfere with the parent-child relationship.

1	(b) Sole physical PHYSICAL and legal custodyA grandparent	<—
2	has standing to bring a petition for sole physical and legal	<—
3	custody of a grandchild. If it is in the best interest of the	
4	child not to be in the custody of either parent AND IF IT IS IN	<—
5	THE BEST INTEREST OF THE CHILD TO BE IN THE CUSTODY OF THE	
б	GRANDPARENT, the court may award sole physical and legal custody	<
7	to the grandparent. This subsection applies to a grandparent:	
8	(1) who has genuine care and concern for the child;	
9	(2) whose relationship with the child began with the

12	(3) who has assumed the role and responsibilities of the
