AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for hindering 3 apprehension or prosecution. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 5105 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: § 5105. Hindering apprehension or prosecution. Offense defined. -- A person commits an offense if, with intent to hinder the apprehension, prosecution, conviction or 10 punishment of another for crime, he: 11 12 (1) harbors or conceals the other; 13 provides or aids in providing a weapon, 14 transportation, disquise or other means of avoiding

(3) conceals or destroys evidence of the crime, or

tampers with a witness, informant, document or other source

- 8 (b) Grading.--The offense is a felony of the third degree if

- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
