1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing for causes for suspension; and providing for academically autonomous school districts.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 1124 of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
12	amended August 8, 1963 (P.L.564, No. 269), is amended to read:
13	Section 1124. Causes for Suspension <u>(a)</u> Any board of
14	school directors may suspend the necessary number of
15	professional employes, for any of the causes hereinafter
16	enumerated:
17	(1) Substantial decrease in pupil enrollment in the school
18	district;
19	(2) Curtailment or alteration of the educational program on

1 recommendation of the superintendent, concurred in by the board 2 of school directors, approved by the Department of Public 3 Instruction, as a result of substantial decline in class or 4 course enrollments or to conform with standards of organization 5 or educational activities required by law or recommended by the 6 Department of Public Instruction;

7 (3) Consolidation of schools, whether within a single
8 district, through a merger of districts, or as a result of joint
9 board agreements, when such consolidation makes it unnecessary
10 to retain the full staff of professional employes.

(4) When new school districts are established as the result of reorganization of school districts pursuant to Article II., subdivision (i) of this act, and when such reorganization makes it unnecessary to retain the full staff of professional employes.

16 (b) An academically autonomous school district as

17 established in section 1524 of this act shall not be subject to 18 this section.

19 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: Section 1524. Academically Autonomous School Districts.--(a) 20 21 The board of school directors of a school district of the 22 second, third or fourth class may by resolution approved by a 23 majority of the members of the board upon the recommendation of the superintendent petition the Secretary of Education for 24 25 designation as an academically autonomous school district. 26 (b) A board of school directors which on or before April 1 27 petitions the Secretary of Education for designation as an 28 academically autonomous school district to commence such designation on July 1 of the succeeding fiscal year and 29 continuing for a period of three full school terms shall be 30 19950H1717B2068 - 2 -

3	(1) The district has demonstrated excellent student
4	performance at the elementary and secondary school levels by
5	meeting all of the following:
б	(i) Documenting that seventy-five (75) per centum of its
7	students, in the aggregate, are above the seventy-fifth
8	percentile for their grade level as demonstrated in nationally
9	normed standardized tests. The Secretary of Education shall
10	annually designate a minimum of five (5) tests which may be used
11	for this purpose.
12	(ii) The proportion of pupils who enter secondary level
13	programs, grades seven through twelve, and who withdraw without
14	completing the high school program in three (3) per centum or
15	less for the three (3) years preceding the petition.
16	(iii) The proportion of pupils who earn a high school
17	diploma and who enroll in postsecondary education, including
18	college, technical school, approved apprenticeship programs, or
19	who enlist in the armed forces of the United States is seventy-
20	five (75) per centum or greater for the three (3) years
21	preceding the petition.
22	(2) The district is reimbursed by the Commonwealth through
23	the Equalized Subsidy for Basic Education (ESBE) twenty-five
24	(25) per centum or less of the district's actual instructional
25	expense per weighted average daily membership (AIE/WADM). The
26	level of reimbursement to the district under this clause shall
27	not have exceeded twenty-five (25) per centum during each of the
28	preceding three (3) years.
29	(c) A board of school directors of a school district of the
30	second, third or fourth class which does not meet all or any of

1	the criteria set forth in subsection (b)(1) and (2) may petition		
2	the Secretary of Education for designation as an academically		
3	autonomous school district for the purpose of fulfilling an		
4	academic improvement program approved by the Secretary of		
5	Education. The Secretary of Education shall promulgate standards		
6	or procedures for academic improvement plans for such districts.		
7	(d) A school district which has been designated academically		
8	autonomous shall certify to the Secretary of Education it		
9	provides a minimum of one hundred eighty (180) days of		
10	instruction or nine hundred (900) hours of instruction at the		
11	elementary level, or nine hundred ninety (990) hours of		
12	instruction at the secondary level, and the following:		
13	(1) At the elementary school level, the following courses		
14	are taught: English, to include spelling, reading and writing;		
15	arithmetic; science; geography; history of the United States and		
16	Pennsylvania; civics; safety education, including regular and		
17	continuous instruction in the dangers and prevention of fires;		
18	health and physiology; physical education; music; and art.		
19	(2) At the secondary school level, the following courses are		
20	offered: English, to include language, literature, speech and		
21	composition; science, to include biology and chemistry;		
22	geography; social studies, to include civics, economics, world		
23	history, history of the United States and Pennsylvania; a		
24	foreign language; mathematics, to include general mathematics		
25	and statistics, algebra and geometry; art; music; physical		
26	education; health and physiology; and safety education,		
27	including regular and continuous instruction in the dangers and		
28	prevention of fires.		
29	(e) Design, content and scheduling of the courses and		
30	curriculum shall be wholly at the discretion of the academically

2	(f) Selection of assignment of personnel to teach; to
3	provide educational specialist services, including, but not
4	limited to: guidance counselors, nurses, home and school
5	visitors, psychologists, instructional media and nutrition
6	specialists; and to provide supervisory and administrative
7	services for the educational program in an academically
8	autonomous school district shall be wholly at the discretion of
9	the district, except where requirements for these positions are
10	specified in Federal statutes or regulations. Nothing herein
11	shall invalidate the provisions of a valid collective bargaining
12	agreement in effect at the time the district is designated
13	academically autonomous during the term of that contract.
14	Further, all employes engaged to fulfill the responsibilities
15	specified in this subsection or who otherwise come in direct
16	contact with children shall have complied with the requirements
17	of section 111 of this act.
18	Section 3. All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar
19	as they are inconsistent with this act.
