19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

20 finds and declares as follows:

21 Conserving our State's natural and wildlife resources is one

1 of the most important responsibilities we have to this and  
2 future generations of this Commonwealth.

3 Hunters and anglers were among the first to realize this  
4 responsibility nearly 100 years ago when they saw firsthand how  
5 expanding civilization and unregulated exploitation has caused  
6 disastrous declines in wildlife population throughout this  
7 Commonwealth.

8 Hunters and anglers took steps to reverse this trend of  
9 exploitation, helping found the conservation movement,  
10 supporting laws to stop the uncontrolled exploitation of  
11 wildlife and helping establish game and fish laws and  
12 enforcement and management practices.

13 Hunters and anglers also suggested and supported laws to  
14 establish special hunting and fishing license fees and special  
15 taxes on their equipment to pay for conservation programs.

16 Junior hunter and angler youth conservation programs  
17 supported and financed by this Commonwealth's hunters and  
18 anglers have benefited hundreds of wildlife species by teaching  
19 our children the ethics of the great outdoors.

20 As individuals and through their organizations, hunters and  
21 anglers volunteer countless hours of their time and money for  
22 local youth conservation programs.

23 The Commonwealth recognizes the importance of junior  
24 conservation programs and the need for additional funding to  
25 ensure that these programs continue to educate our youth on the  
26 importance of our wildlife resources.

27 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
28 hereby enacts as follows:

13 OUTSTANDING QUALITIES, THE FOLLOWING ARE DESIGNATED AS SCENIC  
14 BYWAYS:

18 AND ALONG ROUTE 381 TO THE STATE LINE OF WEST VIRGINIA,  
19 COMMONLY REFERRED TO AS THE LAUREL HIGHLANDS SCENIC BYWAY.

20       (3)   STATE ROUTE 40 FROM THE BORDER OF PENNSYLVANIA AND  
21 MARYLAND TO THE BORDER OF PENNSYLVANIA AND WEST VIRGINIA,  
22 COMMONLY REFERRED TO AS THE NATIONAL ROAD.

26       UPON APPLICATION OF ANY PERSON WHO IS A VETERAN OF A  
27 SUBMARINE CREW, ACCOMPANIED BY A FEE OF \$20 WHICH SHALL BE IN  
28 ADDITION TO THE ANNUAL REGISTRATION FEE AND BY SUCH

7 The department, in consultation with the Youth Hunter and  
8 Angler Education Board, shall design a special youth hunter and

10 accompanied by a fee of \$35 which shall be in addition to the  
11 annual registration fee, the department shall issue the plate  
12 for a passenger car, MOTOR HOME, TRAILER or truck with a gross <—  
13 vehicle weight rating of not more than 9,000 pounds.

14 § 1360. Children First registration plate.

15 The department, in consultation with the Children's Trust  
16 Fund Board, established under the act of December 15, 1988  
17 (P.L.1235, No.151), known as the Children's Trust Fund Act,  
18 shall design a special Children First registration plate. Upon  
19 application of any person, accompanied by a fee of \$35 which  
20 shall be in addition to the annual registration fee, the  
21 department shall issue the plate for a passenger car, motor

27          PLATE FOR A PASSENGER CAR OR TRUCK WITH A GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT  
28          RATING OF NOT MORE THAN 9,000 POUNDS. THE GUARDIAN OF LIBERTY

13 (d) Youth Hunter and Angler Education Fund.--

14 (1) Fifteen dollars of each fee received under section  
15 1359 (relating to youth hunter and angler education plate)  
16 shall be credited to the Youth Hunter and Angler Education  
17 Fund.

18 (2) There is established a special account in the  
19 Treasury Department which shall be known as the Youth Hunter  
20 and Angler Education Fund. The purpose of the Youth Hunter  
21 and Angler Education Fund is to assist this Commonwealth's  
22 nonprofit sportsmen's clubs, Commonwealth natural resource  
23 agencies and other organizations in conducting youth field  
24 days, conservation schools and other related hunter or  
25 trapper or angler youth education programs which are approved  
26 by the Youth Hunter and Angler Education Board.

27 (3) All moneys in the Hunter and Angler Youth Education

16                  (2) The money collected under this section and credited  
17                  to the Children's Trust Fund shall be designated as  
18                  demonstration grants to county children and youth programs  
19                  for community-based child abuse and neglect prevention  
20                  services and family support services. In addition to specific  
21                  programs identified as eligible for grants under the  
22                  Children's Trust Fund Act, services funded by money collected  
23                  under this section shall also include the development of  
24                  court-appointed special advocate programs for children,  
25                  otherwise known as CASA.

26                  (3) In order to qualify for a grant funded by money  
27                  collected under this section, a county children and youth  
28                  agency must demonstrate to the Children's Trust Fund Board  
29                  that the services reflect the unmet needs of children and  
30                  families in the community, that the programs contribute to

1 the coordination of local services for children and families  
2 and that the program could not be funded through existing  
3 Federal or State programs.

4 (4) To the fullest extent possible, the Children's Trust  
5 Fund Board shall ensure the equitable geographic distribution  
6 of the funds to county children and youth programs across the

10 money collected under this section in excess of estimates  
11 approved by the Governor.
