## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for loitering and
- 3 prowling.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 5506 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 5506. Loitering and prowling [at night time].
- 9 [Whoever at night time] (a) Offense defined.--A person
- 10 commits an offense if that person maliciously loiters or
- 11 maliciously prowls around a dwelling house or any other place
- 12 used wholly or in part for living or dwelling purposes,
- 13 belonging to or occupied by another[, is guilty of a misdemeanor
- 14 of the third degree].

- 1 (b) Grading.--Loitering and prowling shall be a misdemeanor
- 2 of the third degree if the offense occurs during the daytime.
- 3 Loitering and prowling shall be a misdemeanor of the second
- 4 degree if the offense occurs at any other time of day.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
