9	Section 1. Section 1601(c) of the act of May 1, 1933
10	(P.L.103, No.69), known as The Second Class Township Code,
11	reenacted and amended November 9, 1995 (P.L.350, No.60), is

13	Section 1601. Ordinances* * *
14	(c) The board of supervisors may prescribe fines not
15	exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for [a violation of a
16	building, housing, property maintenance, health, fire or public
17	safety code or ordinance and for] water, or air and noise
18	pollution violations and not exceeding six hundred dollars
19	(\$600) for a violation of any other township ordinance, except

as provided in section 1601.1. Any person who violates or 1 permits the violation of a township ordinance shall, upon being 2 3 found liable therefor in a civil enforcement proceeding 4 commenced by a municipality, pay the fine set by the board of supervisors plus all court costs, including reasonable attorney 5 fees, incurred by a municipality. No judgment shall be imposed 6 until the date of the determination of a violation by the 7 district justice. If the defendant neither pays nor timely 8 appeals the judgment, the municipality may enforce the judgment 9 10 pursuant to the applicable rules of civil procedure.

Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: <u>Section 1601.1. Collection of Penalties for Violations of</u> <u>Building, Housing, Property Maintenance, Health, Fire or Public</u> <u>Safety Ordinance.--No fine or penalty shall exceed one thousand</u> <u>dollars (\$1,000) for a violation of a building, housing,</u> <u>property maintenance, health, fire or public safety ordinance,</u>

18 except as provided in subsection (c).

19 (b) After thirty days from the initial charge, each day that 20 the violation continues shall constitute a separate violation. 21 If the violation remains unabated after ninety days from the 22 initial charge, the owner of the real property in violation may 23 surrender title to the township in lieu of payment of the

24 <u>accrued penalties.</u>

(c) Any person charged for a violation who fails, without just cause, to begin abatement of the violation within ninety days commits a misdemeanor of the third degree and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) and to imprisonment for not more than one year.
