## A RESOLUTION

Urging that prayer be returned to the public school systems of this nation.

WHEREAS, The first amendment to the Constitution of the United States specifies, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof..."; and

WHEREAS, Our nation was founded by many different beliefs and ideals of settlers from other countries; and

WHEREAS, The framers of the Constitution of the United States sought to protect everyone from one mandated religion; and

WHEREAS, Our nation was founded on freedom of religion and was not founded on freedom from religion; and

WHEREAS, Through time, court decisions and certain interest groups have contributed to the deterioration of those religious beliefs and ideals to the extent that prayer has been banned
from the public school system; and
WHEREAS, The House of Representatives strongly believes that reinstitution of prayer in the public schools will move this nation toward those religious ideals and beliefs upon which it was founded; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives strongly urge that prayer be returned to the public school systems of this nation and invites all townships, boroughs, cities and counties across this Commonwealth to join in an effort to reinstate prayer in the public schools by passing similar resolutions and uniting in a grass roots movement for that purpose.
