## A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, William Penn wanted his Pennsylvania to be a land where people of different languages and customs could live together, where men and women could worship as they choose and where the inhabitants could participate in their government; and WHEREAS, On Sunday, March 10, 1996, Pennsbury Manor, William Penn's country estate on the Delaware River and the only Penn residence open to the public here or abroad, will be the location of the celebration of the 315th Anniversary of Charter
