INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, MAY 7, 1996

A RESOLUTION

1 Designating May 11, 1996, as "International Migratory Bird Day" 2 in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, Each year on the second Saturday in May, the United 4 States and Latin America celebrate "International Migratory Bird 5 Day" in recognition of our need to protect the habitat critical 6 to the survival of migratory birds; and

7 WHEREAS, "International Migratory Bird Day" is a time to
8 build relationships with our Latin American and West Indies

9 neighbors; and

10 WHEREAS, A 1991 Department of the Interior survey of

11 Pennsylvania residents 16 years of age and older found that 3.6
12 million residents feed and observe birds; and

13 WHEREAS, "International Migratory Bird Day" recognizes the 14 economic importance of maintaining bird populations for those 15 engaged in bird-related activities which, according to 1994 16 Department of the Interior figures, has an economic impact in Pennsylvania of \$453 million dollars, creating 6,040 jobs; and
 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth is confronted with the problems
 associated with migratory bird population decline, such as
 habitat fragmentation and loss; and

5 WHEREAS, The conservation of migratory birds depends upon 6 preservation of natural habitats, including wetlands, forests 7 and grasslands; therefore be it

8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate May 11, 9 1996, as "International Migratory Bird Day" in Pennsylvania; and 10 be it further

11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives renew its 12 dedication and commitment to the protection of Pennsylvania's 13 natural resources and the stewardship of natural habitats to 14 preserve this public trust.
