7 (b) Grading. -- A person who violates this section commits a felony of the third degree if the amount involved is \$1,000 or 8 9 more. If the amount involved is less than \$1,000, the person 10 commits a misdemeanor of the first degree. Amounts involved in 11 buying or exchanging Federal food order coupons, stamps or authorization cards committed pursuant to one scheme or course 12 13 of conduct, whether from the same person or several persons, 14 shall be apprepated in determining the grade of the offense. § 7314. Fraudulent traffic in food orders. 15

16 Offense defined. -- A person [is quilty of a summary (a) offense] commits the offense of fraudulent traffic in food 17 18 orders if he, whether acting for himself or for another, 19 directly or indirectly, furnishes or delivers to any person 20 money, merchandise, or anything other than food, on or in 21 exchange for a food order, or furnishes or delivers food on or 22 in exchange for a food order to any person, other than the 23 original recipient of the order, or in quantities or for prices other than those itemized on the food order at the time the food 24 is furnished or delivered. 25

26 (a.1) Grading.--A person who violates this section commits a
27 felony of the third degree if the amount involved is \$1,000 or
28 more. If the amount involved is less than \$1,000, the person
29 commits a misdemeanor of the first degree. Amounts involved in
30 fraudulent traffic in food orders committed pursuant to one

scheme or course of conduct, whether from the same person or
 several persons, shall be aggregated in determining the grade of
 the offense.

4 (b) Additional penalty.--In addition to the penalties
5 otherwise prescribed, the defendant shall also be adjudged to
6 pay to the agency which shall have issued such food order, the
7 face amount thereof.

8 (c) Exception.--Subsection (a) of this section shall not 9 apply to the negotiation of a food order after food to the full 10 amount of the order shall have been furnished thereon to the 11 original recipient of the order.

(d) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "food order" means any order issued by or under the authority of any public relief or assistance agency, authorizing the furnishing and delivery of food to any person therein named or described. Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
