3	wrongful death actions. and for exceptions to governmental

- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 8301(a) of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania
- 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 9 § 8301. Death action.
- 10 (a) General rule. -- An action may be brought, under
- 11 procedures prescribed by general rules, to recover damages for
- 12 the death of an individual caused by the wrongful act or neglect
- 13 or unlawful violence or negligence of another if no [action for
- 14 damages was brought by the injured individual during his
- 15 lifetime.] recovery for the same damages claimed in the wrongful
- 16 <u>death action was obtained by the injured individual during his</u>
- 17 lifetime and any prior actions for the same injuries are

- 1 consolidated with the wrongful death claim so as to avoid a
- 2 <u>duplicate recovery</u>.

- 4 Section 2. Section 8542(b)(1) is amended and the section is <-
- 5 amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 6 § 8542. Exceptions to governmental immunity.
- 7 * * *
- 8 (b) Acts which may impose liability. The following acts by
- 9 a local agency or any of its employees may result in the
- 10 imposition of liability on a local agency:
- 11 (1) Vehicle liability. The operation of any motor
- vehicle in the possession or control of the local agency[.],
- 13 provided that the local agency shall not be liable to any
- 14 <u>plaintiff that claims liability under this subsection if the</u>
- 15 plaintiff was, during the course of the alleged negligence,
- 16 <u>in flight or fleeing apprehension, or resisting arrest by a</u>
- 17 police officer or knowingly aided a group one or more of
- 18 whose members were in flight or fleeing apprehension, or
- 19 resisting arrest by a police officer. As used in this
- 20 paragraph, "motor vehicle" means any vehicle which is self-
- 21 propelled and any attachment thereto, including vehicles
- 22 operated by rail, through water or in the air.

- 24 (d) Evidence. Whenever any plaintiff claims liability under
- 25 <u>subsection (b)(1), evidence is admissible to demonstrate that</u>
- 26 the plaintiff, at any time during the course of the alleged
- 27 negligence, was engaged or participating in willful misconduct,
- 28 <u>including</u>, but not limited to, the illegal possession of
- 29 controlled substances, firearms or ammunition.
- 30 Section $\frac{3}{2}$ 2. This act shall apply to a cause of action that

- 1 accrues on or after the effective date of this act.
- 2 Section 4 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
