- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 8902. Arrest without warrant.
- 9 A police officer, sheriff of a county of the second class and <
- 10 deputy sheriff of a county of the second class LAW ENFORCEMENT
- 11 OFFICER shall have the right of arrest without warrant upon
- 12 probable cause for any of the following offenses:
