2 (f) Definition.--As used in this section the phrase "any 3 substance containing a solvent having the property of releasing toxic vapors or fumes" shall mean any substance containing one 4 5 or more of the following chemical compounds: acetone, acetate, benzene, butyl alcohol, ethyl alcohol, ethylene dichloride, 6 7 freon, GASEOUS OR LIQUID FLUOROCARBONS, isopropyl alcohol, 8 methyl alcohol, methyl ethyl ketone, pentachlorophenol, petroleum ether, or toluene. 9
