We, the undersigned, Committee of Conference on the part of the House of Representatives and Senate for the purpose of considering House Bill No. 847, entitled:

"An act to provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1997, to June 30, 1998, * * * and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997. TO PROVIDE FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE

EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE AND JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH, THE PUBLIC DEBT AND FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 1997, TO JUNE 30, 1998, * * * AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1996,"

(b) State Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in
this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the
several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other

16 (h) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account. -- The following 17 sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 18 appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 19 20 Executive Department for the purposes set forth herein for the 21 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, and for the payment of bills 22 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997. 23

20 (k) Home Investment Trust Fund. -- The following sums set 21 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are 22 hereby specifically appropriated from the Home Investment Trust 23 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 24 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, 25 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly 26 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the 27 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 28 29 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 30 19970H0847B1725 - 17 -

5 (1) Ben Franklin/IRC Partnership Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, 6 7 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Ben Franklin/IRC Partnership Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the 8 9 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of 10 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the 11 duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the 12 13 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of 14 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary 15 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities 16 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year 17 beginning July 1, 1997, and for the payment of bills incurred 18 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997. 19

4 (n) Banking Department Fund.--The following sums set forth 5 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 6 specifically appropriated from the Banking Department Fund to 7 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of 8 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 9 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 10 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 11 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 12 13 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 14 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 15 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 16 1997, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 17 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997.

18 (o) Firearm Ownership Fund. -- The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 19 20 specifically appropriated from the Firearm Ownership Fund to the 21 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 22 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other 23 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers 24 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for 25 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as 26 27 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct 28 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes 29 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 30 1997, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid 19970H0847B1725 - 19 -

1 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997.

2 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.--The 3 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this 4 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 5 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and 6 7 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated 8 herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997, and for the 9 10 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of 11 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997. Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal 12 13 year.

14 Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations.--15 The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as 16 may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 17 Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several 18 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the 19 Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and 20 carrying out the program stated herein for the fiscal year 21 beginning July 1, 1997, and for the payment of bills incurred 22 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997. Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include 23 24 any carryover from the prior fiscal year.

Section 107. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are 19970H0847B1725 - 20 - 1 provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1997.

(b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small
Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
cities and communities that have a high concentration of
impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet
community development needs.

8 (c) Community Services Block Grant. -- The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and 9 10 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on 11 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 12 13 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old 14 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements 15 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to 16 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The
Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
for the provision of preventive health and other health services
related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis, domestic
violence services and rodent control.

(e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The 24 25 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to 26 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for 27 28 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with special health care needs, and in providing health services for 29 30 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health 19970H0847B1725 - 21 -

1 care.

(f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. -- The Low-2 3 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help 4 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income 5 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds 6 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds 7 received pursuant to a Presidential release of weather-related 8 9 contingency funds shall be exempt from the 15% requirement if 10 the weather emergency has an impact in Pennsylvania. Unexpended 11 weatherization funds which would result in LIHEABG funds being returned to the Federal Department of Health and Human Services 12 13 may be spent for assistance grants at the discretion of the 14 Secretary of the Budget. The Secretary of the Budget shall notify the Majority Chairman and the Minority Chairman of the 15 16 Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the Majority Chairman and the Minority Chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the 17 18 House of Representatives of the intent to reallocate any such 19 funds ten days prior to any reallocation.

(g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block
Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
persons.

(h) Child Care and Development Block Grant.--The Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) is for the provision of direct child care or to increase the availability of child care for low-income families.

(i) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health
Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of
services to adults with serious mental illness or children with
serious emotional disturbance.

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(j) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.
