The actual 13 privileges granted to the holder of a junior resident combination license shall not be exercised until that person 14 in fact is 12 years of age. 15 \* \* \* 16 (11.1) Junior nonresident combination hunting and 17 18 furtaker license, INCLUDING AN ARCHERY STAMP, A MUZZLELOADER STAMP AND A BEAR LICENSE, to nonresidents who have reached or 19 20 will reach their 12th birthday in the calendar year of application for a license but who have not reached their 17th 21 22 birthday prior to the date of the application for the license 23 and who present a written request, containing the signature 2.4 of a parent or quardian, for the issuance of a license.
