AN ACT

Amending the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), entitled, 2 as reenacted, "An act providing for independent oversight and 3 review of regulations, creating an Independent Regulatory Review Commission, providing for its powers and duties and 5 making repeals, "further providing for criteria for review of 6 regulations. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 5(c) of the act of June 25, 1982 9 10 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act, reenacted 11 and amended June 30, 1989 (P.L.73, No.19), is amended to read: 12 Section 5. Proposed regulation; criteria for review, existing 13 regulations. 14 15 The standing committee shall, within 20 calendar days 16 from the date of receipt of the information required under 17 subsection (b.4), approve or disapprove the final-form regulation. If the 20 calendar days do not include three days 18

during which the General Assembly is convened for a voting

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- 1 <u>session</u>, the review period shall be extended until this
- 2 <u>condition is satisfied.</u> The standing committee shall notify the
- 3 commission of approval or disapproval. Failure of a standing
- 4 committee to disapprove a regulation within the [20 calendar
- 5 days] review period shall constitute approval thereof. Along
- 6 with a notification of approval or disapproval the committee
- 7 shall convey to the commission and the agency a report which
- 8 includes a summary of the objections of the committee, if any,
- 9 stating the reasons why the committee has found the proposed
- 10 regulation unacceptable, and a copy of any staff reports deemed
- 11 pertinent by the committee. Such reasons shall include, but not
- 12 be limited to, deviations from the statutory authority of the
- 13 agency and the intention of the General Assembly in the
- 14 enactment of the statute upon which the proposed regulation was
- 15 based. In the event the standing committees are prevented from
- 16 completing their [20-day] review during the time frame under
- 17 <u>this subsection</u> because of expiration of the legislative session
- 18 in even-numbered years, consideration of the final-form
- 19 regulation shall be automatically suspended until the fourth
- 20 Monday in January of the next succeeding session of the General
- 21 Assembly. On that date, the agency shall resubmit the final-form
- 22 regulation to the designated standing committee of each chamber,
- 23 or its successor committee, and to the commission. The standing
- 24 committees, or their successor committees, shall [have 20] be
- 25 <u>limited to 20</u> calendar days <u>unless the period is extended to</u>
- 26 <u>meet the requirements of this section</u> and the commission shall
- 27 have 30 calendar days from receipt of the final-form regulation
- 28 and the information required under subsection (b.4) is received
- 29 to review such regulation. In computing the [20-day] committee
- 30 review period and the 30-day commission review period, the

- 1 number of days in which the final-form regulation had been under
- 2 review by the standing committees and by the commission as of
- 3 the expiration of the prior session shall be subtracted from the
- 4 [20-day] committee review period and the 30-day commission
- 5 review periods, respectively. Failure of the agency to resubmit
- 6 the final-form regulation on the fourth Monday in January of the
- 7 next succeeding session shall constitute withdrawal thereof. No
- 8 final-form regulation shall be submitted to the commission or
- 9 the standing committees for review during the period from the
- 10 end of the legislative session of even-numbered years to the
- 11 fourth Monday in January of the next succeeding legislative
- 12 session, but emergency regulations may be adopted pursuant to
- 13 the provisions of section 6(b).
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- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
