AN ACT

- 1 Providing for mandated community service as a requirement for
- 2 graduation for all public high school students in this
- 3 Commonwealth.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Community
- 8 Service Learning Act.
- 9 Section 2. Legislative intent.
- 10 It is the intent of the General Assembly by this act to
- 11 provide high school students with an enhanced sense of the
- 12 importance of volunteer activity and good citizenship which come
- 13 from service contributions to their respective communities.
- 14 Section 3. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 18 "Community service." Unpaid work performed for the benefit

- 1 of a community.
- 2 "Community service learning." A structural learning
- 3 experience involving community service with planned time periods
- 4 for preparation, action and reflection.
- 5 "Credit." The locally determined numerical award given to a
- 6 student for the successful demonstration or successful
- 7 completion of established learning outcomes for a required
- 8 course of study.
- 9 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 10 Commonwealth.
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 12 Section 4. Community Service Learning Program.
- 13 (a) Establishment.-- Each board of school directors shall
- 14 appoint a committee of teachers, administrators, parents and,
- 15 wherever possible, representatives of volunteer organizations to
- 16 develop and implement for each public high school under their
- 17 jurisdiction a community service learning program which shall be
- 18 completed as a prerequisite for graduation from high school.
- 19 Community service learning activities shall be designed to meet
- 20 the needs of others in the school or community and to enhance
- 21 the student's personal growth, career exploration, understanding
- 22 of community and citizenship, social science skills and
- 23 communication skills.
- 24 (b) Content of program. -- The board of school director's
- 25 appointed committee shall recommend a community service learning
- 26 program which will address, at a minimum, all of the following:
- 27 (1) The community service learning program shall consist
- of at least 20 hours of individual student-performed
- 29 community service performed during the student's junior or
- 30 senior year in high school.

- 1 (2) Preliminary training in volunteerism for student
- 2 participants conducted, when possible, by organizations
- 3 experienced in such training.
- 4 (3) Supervision of the student volunteers to ensure
- 5 appropriate placement and adequate learning opportunity.
- 6 (4) Integration of academic learning with the service
- 7 experience.
- 8 (5) The award of an appropriate level of credits toward
- 9 graduation with a required minimum equivalent to 20 hours of
- 10 service.
- 11 (6) A student shall not receive compensation for
- 12 community service or substitute employment for service
- 13 activity.
- 14 (7) Such other factors as the board of school directors
- deems necessary to establish and implement a successful
- 16 community service learning program.
- 17 (c) Joint and cooperative activities. -- A school district may
- 18 provide joint or cooperative community service learning
- 19 activities with another school district or an institution of
- 20 higher education.
- 21 (d) Duty of secretary. -- The secretary shall, upon the
- 22 request of the board of school directors having supervision over
- 23 any high school, provide any technical assistance which may be
- 24 necessary to aid a district in the planning and implementation
- 25 of its youth community service program.
- 26 Section 4. Implementation.
- 27 (a) Plan. -- The community service learning program will be
- 28 submitted to the secretary no later than June 1, 2000. The plan
- 29 submitted to the secretary shall be recommended by a committee
- 30 appointed by the board of school directors. The plan cannot

- 1 become effective unless it is approved by the school board.
- 2 (b) Graduation classes to be affected.--Local school
- 3 districts shall begin implementation of the community service
- 4 learning program with the school year beginning in the year 2000
- 5 for all students who are expected to graduate in the year 2004.
- 6 Section 5. Effective date.
- 7 This act shall take effect immediately.
