## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the week of March 17 through 23, 1997, as
- 2 "Agriculture Week" and March 20, 1997, as "Agriculture Day"
- 3 in Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, Agriculture has been an integral part of this
- 5 Commonwealth's social and economic culture since colonial days;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, The hard work and dedication of this Commonwealth's
- 8 farm families and farm laborers over the generations have made
- 9 agriculture the number one industry in this Commonwealth; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Although total farm acreage has declined over the
- 11 years, this trend has been outweighed by improved farming
- 12 methods, including the use of computer technology and
- 13 biotechnology; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Commercial agricultural production and related
- 15 agribusinesses in this Commonwealth have solidified the position

- 1 of Pennsylvania agriculture in the national economy and made it
- 2 a growing segment of the global economy; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania agricultural exports were valued at
- 4 \$513 million in 1995, a 13% increase over the value of
- 5 agricultural exports during the previous fiscal year; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In 1995, Pennsylvania agricultural exports ranked
- 7 fourth in dairy products, eighth in hides and skins, ninth in
- 8 animal fats and tenth in prepared fruits, live animals and meat;
- 9 and
- 10 WHEREAS, In 1995, preliminary cash receipts from marketing
- 11 were \$3.74 billion, cash incomes from crops were estimated at
- 12 \$1.8 billion, and incomes from livestock and livestock products
- 13 totaled \$2.61 billion; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In 1995, Pennsylvania agriculture ranked first in
- 15 the nation in mushroom production, second in ice cream
- 16 production, third in egg production, fourth in milk production,
- 17 seventh in wholesale sales of floriculture crops and tenth in
- 18 commercial red meat production; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Despite uncooperative weather patterns and other
- 20 problems unique to farming, Pennsylvania farmers continue to
- 21 produce a variety of quality products for the nutritional
- 22 enjoyment of the people of this Commonwealth and the nation; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Agriculture is a source of pride for the citizens of
- 24 this Commonwealth and the nation who have had the opportunity to
- 25 view the picturesque farms, savor the food products and attend
- 26 the annual Farm Show; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The beginning of spring, when farmers are tilling
- 28 their fields in anticipation of a new planting season, is the
- 29 most appropriate time for all Pennsylvanians to celebrate the
- 30 accomplishments of the agriculture industry in general and this

- 1 Commonwealth's farm families in particular; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 3 week of March 17 through 23, 1997, as "Agriculture Week" and
- 4 March 20, 1997, as "Agriculture Day" in Pennsylvania and call
- 5 upon the people of this Commonwealth to salute farm families,
- 6 farm laborers and persons involved in agribusinesses for their
- 7 hard work and dedication to Pennsylvania agriculture by
- 8 observing "Agriculture Day" and "Agriculture Week" with
- 9 appropriate programs, ceremonies and activities.
