A RESOLUTION

- 1 Affirming English as the primary language in Pennsylvania and 2 recognizing both the will of many language minorities in this
- 3 Commonwealth to become fluent in English and their right to
- 4 communicate in their native tongue while learning and until
- 5 becoming fluent in English.
- 6 WHEREAS, No one disputes that English is the primary language
- 7 of the United States; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Language minorities in this country have always had
- 9 to face the fact that not learning English places them at a
- 10 disadvantage; and
- 11 WHEREAS, It is nonetheless the right of any person to use his
- 12 or her mother tongue to communicate until becoming fluent in
- 13 English; and
- 14 WHEREAS, There is a growing provincialism in this
- 15 Commonwealth and the United States that would deny persons whose
- 16 primary language is not English basic services, such as
- 17 materials explaining how to vote, or the right to learn in their
- 18 primary language until they become fluent in English; therefore
- 19 be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives affirm the
- 2 position of English as the principal language of this
- 3 Commonwealth and the right of language minorities to communicate
- 4 in their mother tongue while learning and until becoming fluent
- 5 in English.
