A RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4 5 6	Designating September 29, 1997, as "J. Horace McFarland Day" and promoting public recognition of his accomplishments in environmental protection, the study of horticulture, the development of printing processes and the advancement of civic projects that improved the quality of life for citizens in Pennsylvania, the United States and internationally.
7	WHEREAS, J. Horace McFarland was born in McAlisterville,
8	Juniata County, September 29, 1859, and became a resident of the
9	City of Harrisburg, Dauphin County; and
10	WHEREAS, Mr. McFarland became a successful businessperson by
11	founding the J. Horace McFarland Press and was a community
12	leader in Harrisburg in the early 1900s; and
13	WHEREAS, Mr. McFarland was the driving force behind bringing
14	modern improvements to Harrisburg, including developing the City
15	Island water filtration plant, a public sewage system,
16	Riverfront Park and Wildwood Lake Park, paving streets and
17	building flood control projects, and he served as the secretary
18	of the Municipal League of Harrisburg from 1901 to 1946; and
19	WHEREAS, Mr. McFarland took his "Harrisburg Plan" for

promoting civic improvements through education of the public 1 2 about the benefits of open space, recreation areas and good 3 public facilities to communities across the United States; and 4 WHEREAS, The "Harrisburg Plan" and similar civic improvement 5 efforts developed into the nationwide "City Beautiful" movement and led to the establishment of the American Civic Association 6 with Mr. McFarland as the first president in 1904 and with 7 Harrisburg serving as its first headquarters; and 8

WHEREAS, Mr. McFarland fought for the establishment of the 9 10 National Park Service in 1916 and worked hand-in-hand with 11 Theodore Roosevelt, John Muir, founder of the Sierra Club, and 12 naturalist John Burroughs on the preservation of Yosemite and 13 Yellowstone parks, Niagara Falls, the Everglades and many other 14 natural and scenic areas across the United States; and 15 WHEREAS, Mr. McFarland served as an active member of the 16 United States Department of the Interior's Educational Advisory 17 Board for parks and as a member of the National Park Trust Fund 18 until his death in 1948; and

WHEREAS, Mr. McFarland's interest in horticulture and the raising of roses led in 1915 to the unprecedented growth of the American Rose Society, which had an international impact on the propagation of roses and was headquatered in Harrisburg for many years; and

24 WHEREAS, The Greater Harrisburg Rose Society, also organized 25 by Mr. McFarland, is this year celebrating its 50th anniversary; 26 and

27 WHEREAS, Mr. McFarland was a worldwide influence and 28 innovator in the photomechanical processes of color printing; 29 and

30 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission 19970H0245R2252 - 2 - and author Ernest Morrison are being commended by the American
Association for State and Local History for a 1995 biography of
Mr. McFarland entitled J. Horace McFarland: A Thorn for Beauty;
and

5 WHEREAS, The Honorable Bruce Babbitt, Secretary of the United 6 States Department of the Interior, called J. Horace McFarland an 7 "almost forgotten hero" of the "City Beautiful" and preservation 8 movements; therefore be it

9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate 10 September 29, 1997, as "J. Horace McFarland Day" to call public 11 attention to the contributions J. Horace McFarland made to 12 protecting the environment, the study of horticulture and to 13 promoting civic projects that improved the standard and quality 14 of life for citizens in Pennsylvania and throughout the United 15 States.
