4	WHEREAS, May is "National Physical Fitness and Sports Month";

7	broader promotion of physical fitness activities and programs in
8	schools, park and recreation departments, employee associations,
9	hospitals and other agencies involved in physical fitness; and
10	WHEREAS, Many residents of this Commonwealth would improve
11	the quality of their lives through proper exercise and diet; and

1 WHEREAS, The Surgeon General of the United States Public Health Service's 1996 Report on Physical Activity and Health has 2 3 further verified that regular physical activity is associated with improved health-related quality of life; therefore be it 4 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives observe May 1 through 7, 1998, as "National Physical Education and Sports 6 7 Week" and encourage the residents of Pennsylvania to support the 8 schools' physical education programs; and be it further 9 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives observe the month of May 1998 as "National Physical Fitness and Sports Month" in 10 Pennsylvania and encourage the residents of Pennsylvania to be 11 physically active on a regular basis. 12
