14	Section 1. The act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as
15	the Tax Reform Code of 1971, is amended by adding a section to

17	Section 356.1. Check-off for the Arts(a) Individuals,
18	estates or trusts on whom a personal income tax is imposed by
19	the provisions of this article shall have the right to elect
20	whether or not one dollar (\$1) of the tax on a return filed by
21	them shall be used to provide funding for the arts.
