## AN ACT

1 2	Providing for early childhood education improvement grants; and making an appropriation.
3	The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
4	(1) The quality of education children receive in their
5	earliest years lays a critical foundation for later success
6	in school and the workplace.
7	(2) Increased investment in the early grades of
8	kindergarten through third grade can lead to greater student
9	academic achievement and savings to the public school system
10	in reduced costs of remedial and special education and
11	programs for disruptive students.
12	(3) Despite the proven benefits of full-day kindergarten
13	programs, many school districts have found the costs of such
14	programs prohibitive.
15	(4) Research and experience have demonstrated that young
16	children in small classes have higher achievement than young
17	children in larger classes.

1 (5) New findings on how young children develop and learn 2 have led to more effective teaching strategies, and public 3 school professionals need access to quality professional 4 development opportunities in order to utilize these new 5 teaching strategies in their classrooms. 6 (6) While many school districts need financial assistance to invest in early childhood education 7 8 improvements, they also need flexibility to determine which 9 initiative best meets the needs of their students and families. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 12 13 Section 1. Short title. 14 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Early 15 Childhood Education Improvement Grant Act. Section 2. Definitions. 16 17 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 18 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 19 context clearly indicates otherwise: 20 "Aid ratio," The aid ratio as defined in section 2501(14) of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public 21 School Code of 1949. 22 23 "Department." The Department of Education of the 24 Commonwealth. "Eligible district." A school district with an aid ratio 25 26 equal to or greater than 0.6000. 27 Section 3. Early childhood education improvement grants. 28 (a) Full-day kindergarten grants.--Beginning with the 1997-29 1998 school year and each school year thereafter, an eligible 30 district that operates a full-day kindergarten program with a

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1 full-day kindergarten average daily membership of ten or more
2 students shall receive a grant from the department equal to:
3 \$1,000 X the full-day kindergarten average daily membership X
4 the aid ratio for the district.

5 (b) Classroom-based grants.--Beginning with the 1997-1998 6 school year and each school year thereafter, an eligible 7 district that has an average daily membership of not more than 8 22 students for the kindergarten through third grade classrooms, 9 shall receive a grant from the department equal to:

10 \$1,000 X the average daily membership of the kindergarten 11 through third grade classrooms X the aid ratio of the 12 district.

13 (c) Teacher-based grants.--Beginning with the 1997-1998 14 school year and each school year thereafter, an eligible 15 district that operates an early childhood education and 16 professional development program approved by the department for 17 kindergarten through third grade classroom teachers shall 18 receive a grant from the department equal to:

19 \$500 X the number of classroom teachers in kindergarten 20 through third grade X the aid ratio of the district. 21 No eligible district shall receive more than \$500,000 under this 22 subsection.

(d) Multiple grants.--An eligible district may receive any or all of the grants specified in subsections (a) through (c) provided that the district meets the requirements set forth in each subsection as applicable.

(e) Effect of grants.--Grants received under this section
shall be in addition to and shall not affect any other payment
that an eligible district may receive from the Commonwealth.
Section 4. Appropriation.

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1 The sum of \$42,000,000, or as much thereof as may be 2 necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Education 3 for the fiscal year July 1, 1997, to June 30, 1998, in order to 4 provide early childhood education improvement grants under this 5 act.

6 Section 5. Effective date.

7 This act shall take effect July 1, 1997, or immediately,8 whichever is later.
