A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating Saturday, February 14, 1998, as "Read to Your Child 2 Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Reading is the most fundamental skill required to
- 4 participate in the economic and cultural life of America and
- 5 this Commonwealth; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Reading scores on both the Scholastic Aptitude Tests
- 7 and elementary and high school proficiency tests have been
- 8 declining in recent years; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Nearly 15% of all college freshmen in America are
- 10 enrolled in remedial reading classes, being unable to read at
- 11 the level required to do their course work; and
- 12 WHEREAS, A variety of nonprofit organizations at the State,
- 13 county and local levels have programs aimed at helping
- 14 Pennsylvanians of all ages and backgrounds improve their reading
- 15 skills; and
- 16 WHEREAS, More than 98% of Pennsylvanians have access to

- 1 public libraries; and
- 2 WHEREAS, No amount of spending or instruction in schools can
- 3 substitute for parents who read, encourage their children to
- 4 read and take time to read to and with their children; therefore
- 5 be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate Saturday, February 14,
- 7 1998, as "Read to Your Child Day" in Pennsylvania and encourage
- 8 all parents to take time to help their children become better
- 9 and more active readers.
