- 3 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State Capitol Building has endured
- 4 as a landmark of democracy unifying art, history and
- 5 architecture; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Throughout the 20th century the Commonwealth has
- 7 remained committed to preserve the integrity of the original
- 8 beauty of the Capitol Building and ensure that it will be
- 9 sustained for future generations; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In 1901, architect Joseph Miller Huston noted his
- 11 determination to make the Capitol Building "the greatest work
- 12 ever produced in America"; and
- 13 WHEREAS, More than 79,000 people visit the Capitol Building
- 14 annually; therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the Pennsylvania Capitol
- 16 Building as a "Commonwealth Treasure" as designated by the

- 1 Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission in order to truly
- 2 salute these efforts and the Pennsylvania pride they allow us to
